vietion of General stoessel is large ncuon of General stoessel is large defense of Port.Arthur caused the disgrace of General Fock, tis, fatally wounded as the result of a duel with the latter general at an early hour yes terday morning.
General Fock, belleving his honor had been assalled, made written dehim in a duel. The men faced each other by arrangement early yesterday in the-Chevalier guard riding school, aring at close distance with plstols. General Smirnoff was acting commandant of Port Arthur fortress during the slege, and at the time of its surrender to the Japanese. After his re-
turn to Russia he prepared a secret report of the defense of Port Arthur port of the defense of Port Arthur upon which the basis of the Indict-
ments which Leutenant General Stoes. sel, Lleutenant General Fock and Major'General Reiss were tried for their iives before the supreme court marthal.
General Stoessel was accused of cow ardice and incapacity, and General
Fock, according to the indcitment, disFock, according to the indectment, dis-
played thorough incapacity and want of judgment. The outcome of the trial was the sentencing to death of General Stoessel, which finding was later commuted to ten years imprisonment, while General Fock was ordered to be reprimanded for a disciplinary offease. General Smirnoft was also on trial
before the court martial, charged with before the court martial, charged with
having talled to remove General Fock trom command after he suspected an agreement between Generals Stoessel and Foek to surrender the fortress. The riding school was placed at the disposal of the combatants by the commander of the regiment, and the duel oceurred with the full knowledge and approbation of the military authorities. It was witnessed by several officers of
high rank, and it is even reported that several women were present. Shortly before 10 o'clock Generals. Fock and smirnoft appeared at the riding school and, without saluting, took places assigned them by thetr seconds. The distance between the two combatants Was but twenty paces and the duellists
were instructed to open fire at the were instructed to open fire at the
word of commaha and continue until one or the other was killed. At General Fock's fourth shot Genoral Smirnoft groaned and sank forward. He had been wounded in the abdomen above the right hip. He was
