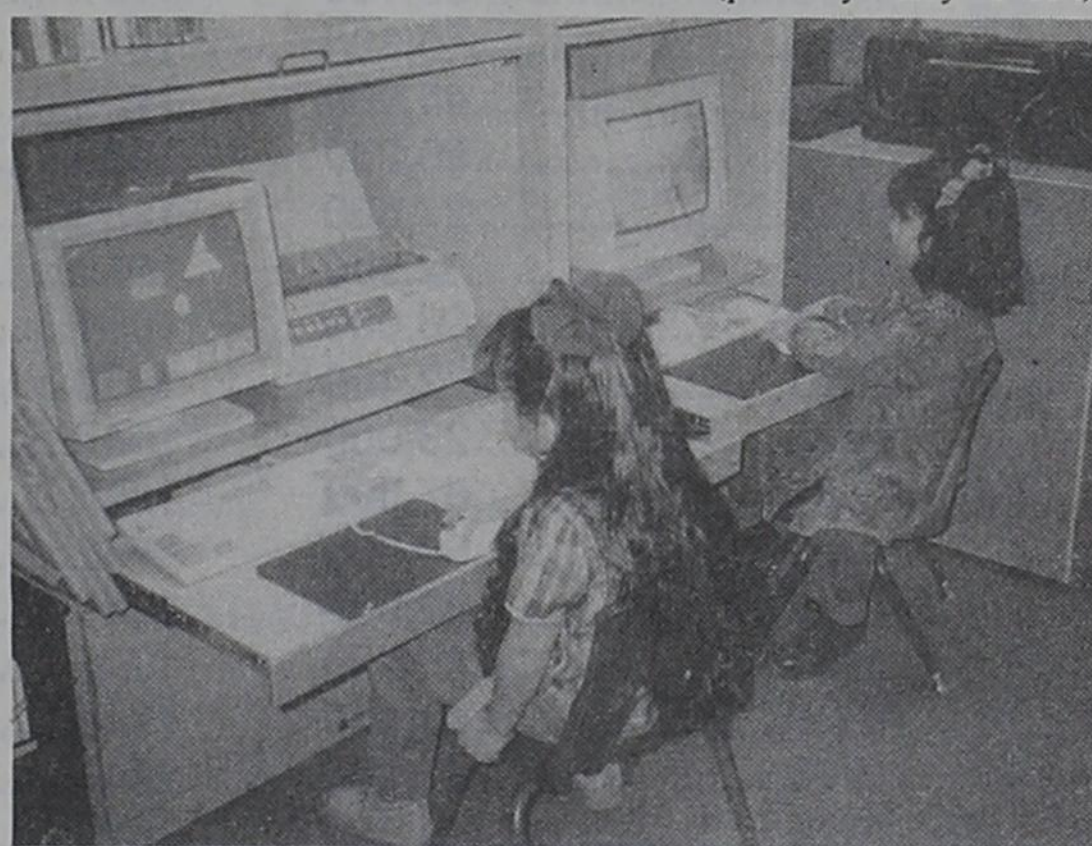

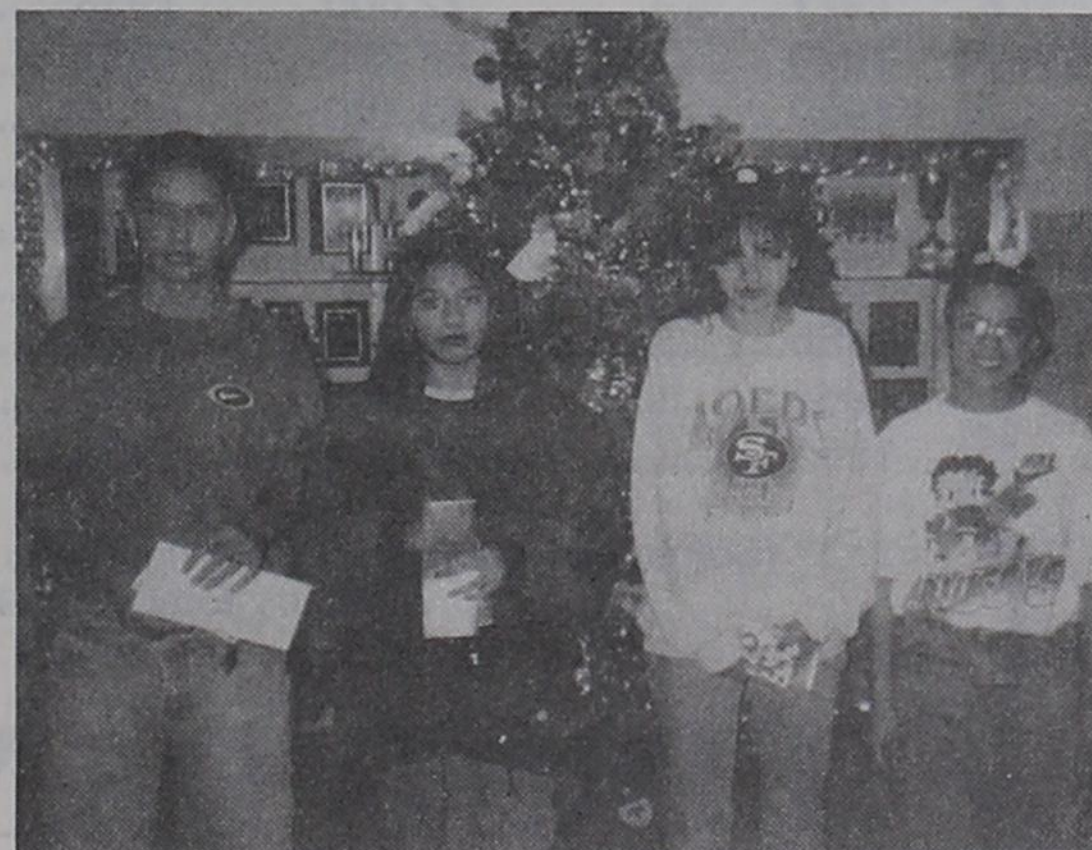

All parents interested in the Bovina Youth Basketball League are asked to attend an organization meeting Thursday, January 30 at 7:30 p.m. in the high school library.

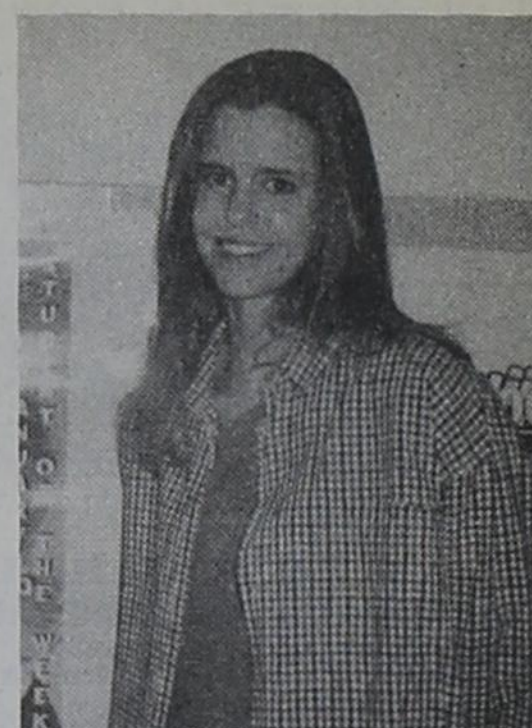

Ortiz received 76 votes, Bryan Thurmond 64, and George Villarreal 35.



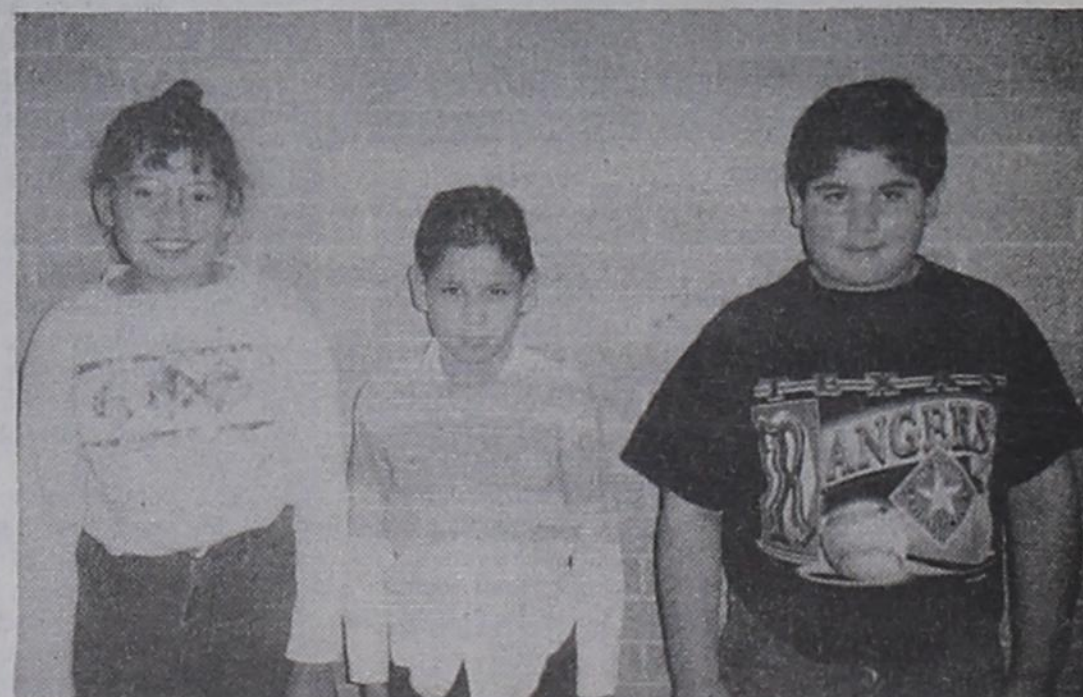

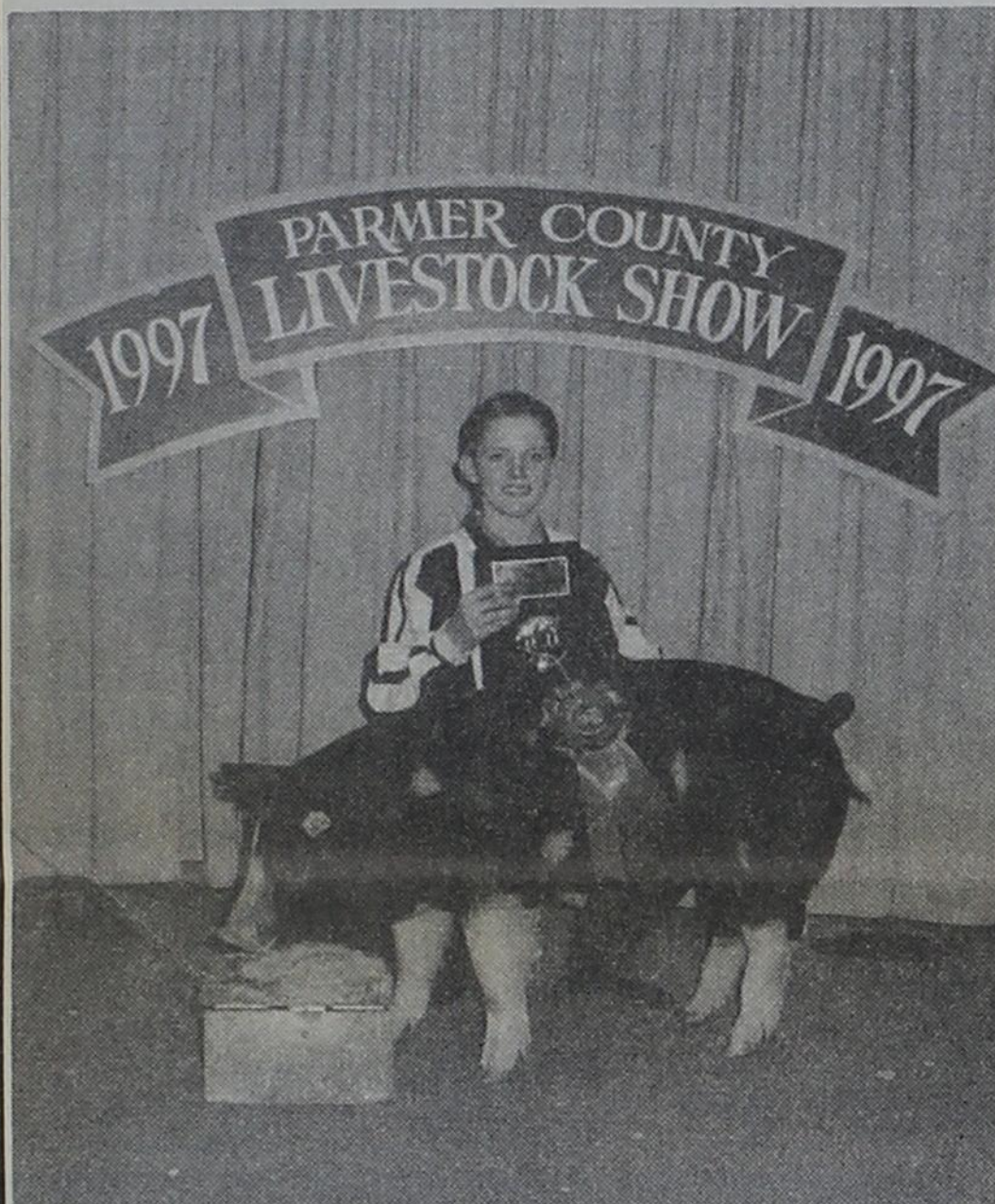
