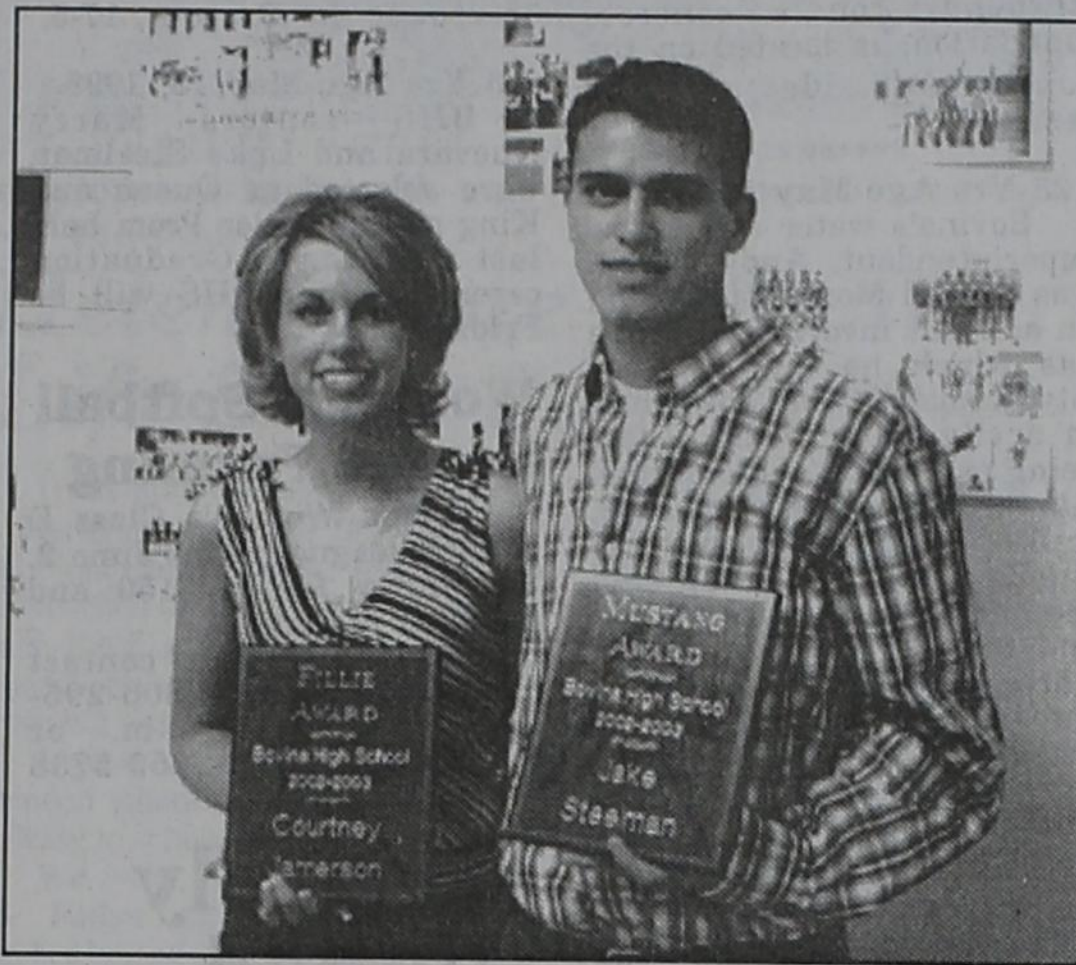

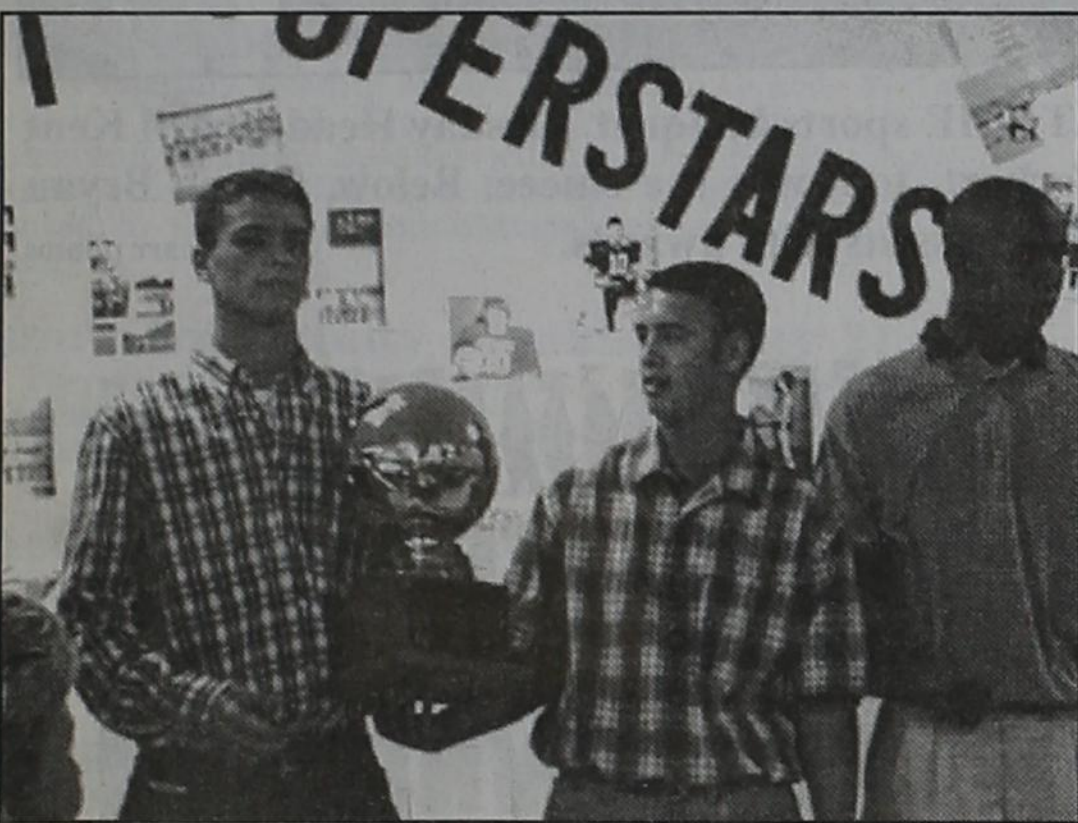

Carter Named Interim BISD Superintendent

The Bovina School Board met in regular session May 8 and again in a special session May 12.

In the May 8 meeting, new board members Kevin Hughes and Mike Beauchamp were sworn in. Board member Susan Kerby nominated Beauchamp for board president. The motion passed 5/1 with Beauchamp abstaining and Justin Brozek voting against.

Kevin Hughes nominated Joe Steelman as board vice-president. The motion passed 6/0 with Steelman abstaining. Susan Kerby was re-elected as board secretary.

In other action, the board approved school lunch and breakfast prices for 2003-04; approved recommendations for the TASB Media Honor Roll for Ron Carr of the Bovina Blade and Cara Correnti from KVII-TV; and approved the availability of two Grow Your Own Teacher scholarships for the 2003-04 school year.

In personnel actions, the resignation of Donna Plummer was accepted; probationary contracts were extended to Maricela Guevara, Ondina Kennedy and Kathy Adams for the 2003-04 school year; and a probationary contract was extended to Dusty Ortiz as a teacher/coach for the 2003-04 year.

At the May 12 special meeting, the board accepted the resignation of Superintendent Michael Downes. He was hired as superintendent at Big Spring ISD.

Stone, city manager Ernest Terry, city secretary Bonnie Scaff, public works superintendent Andy Garza, police chief Leon Saddler, municipal judge J.E. Sherrill and Lance Teague.

Gomez Faces Murder Charge

Capital murder charges have been filed against Jose Gomez in the April 14 death of Friona Police Sgt. Joe Herrera.

Gomez, who is recovering from injuries in the car wreck, is incarcerated in the Potter County jail infirmary. He is being held without bond.

After approving prior minutes and payment of vouchers, the council canvassed May 3 election results.

Mayor Hromas presented outgoing alderman Kevin Hughes a key to the city. Hughes ran for and was elected to the school board. He was replaced in the May 3 election by Lance "Bubba" Teague.

The mayor welcomed Teague to the council as well as incumbents John Blackwell and Mike McCallum. Judge Sherrill swore in the three men. Bubba took his seat at the table and the meeting continued.

Alderman Stan Miller was elected by acclamation as the new Mayor Pro-Tem. The council amended the city code to include Ordinance 90-8-1 pertaining to substandard buildings, structures or vegetation.

After hearing the city manager reports, Aldermen voted to transfer funds from a savings account to the general account to finance a new engine for the police patrol car.

The next meeting of the Bovina city council will be June 12, 2003.

County Emergency Responders Meet

If you place a 9-1-1 call from a cell phone, the first thing you should tell the dispatcher is your location. It costs \$69,147 per year to operate Parmer County's emergency 9-1-1 system.

Those were two of the many topics discussed when Parmer County emergency service providers gathered at the Bovina EMS Building Thursday, May 8, 2003, to discuss the 9-1-1 emergency service system in Parmer County.

The meeting was prompted by a recent incident involving a 9-1-1 call from Lazbuddie. Lazbuddie resident Skip Magby suffered a

heart attack at his home. Frantic efforts by relatives to report the incident by calling 9-1-1 using both cell phones and regular phones resulted in delay and confusion in dispatching the Lazbuddie ambulance.

The Thursday meeting was officiated by Pam Nielsen, Director of the Panhandle Regional 9-1-1 Network out of Amarillo. It's purpose was to discuss how emergency providers in the county can communicate more efficiently and effectively when providing 9-1-1 service to county residents.

EMS and fire first responders from Friona, Bovina,

Farwell and Lazbuddie attended. Also present were county commissioners, County Judge Bonnie Heald, Friona and Bovina city managers, law enforcement personnel and several interested private citizens.

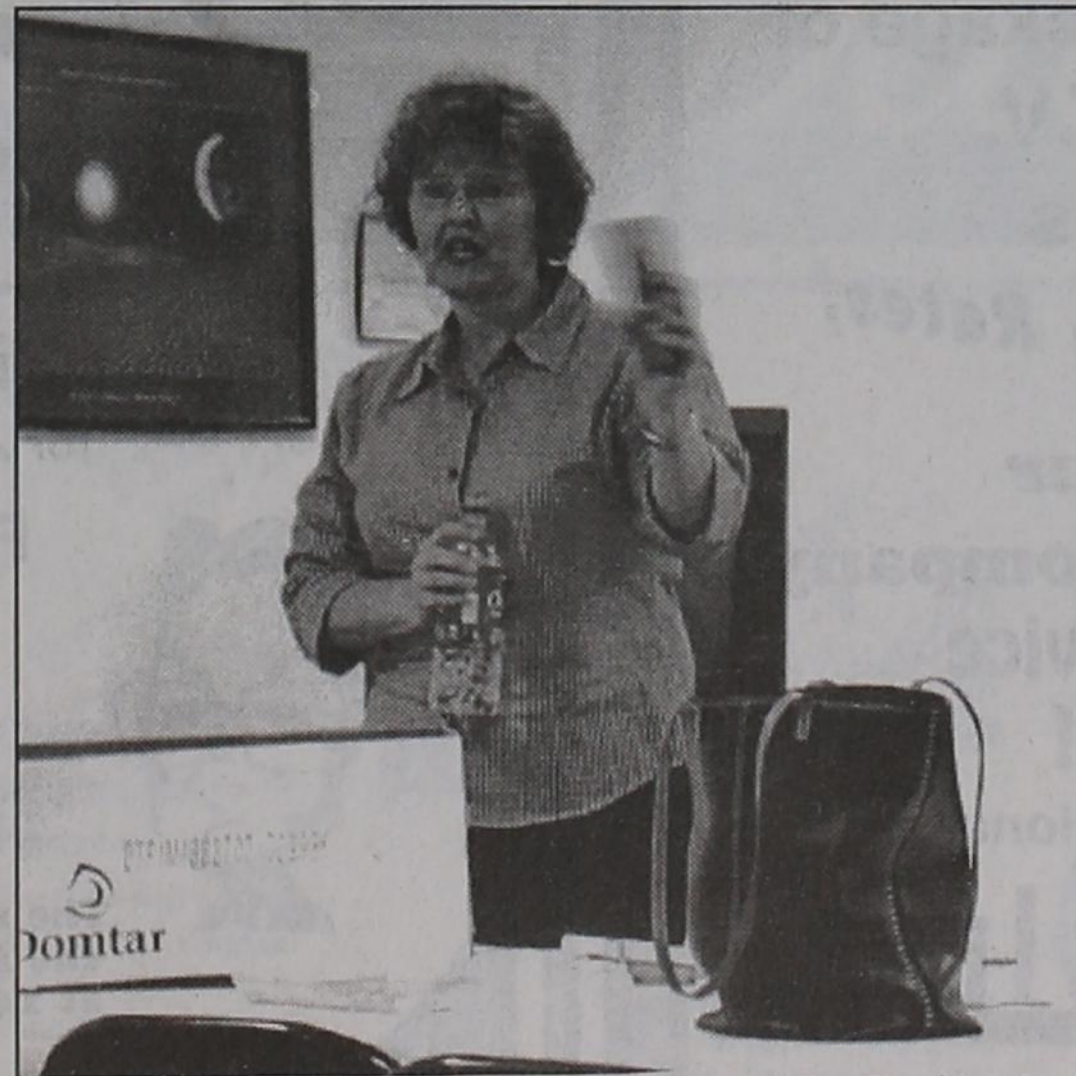
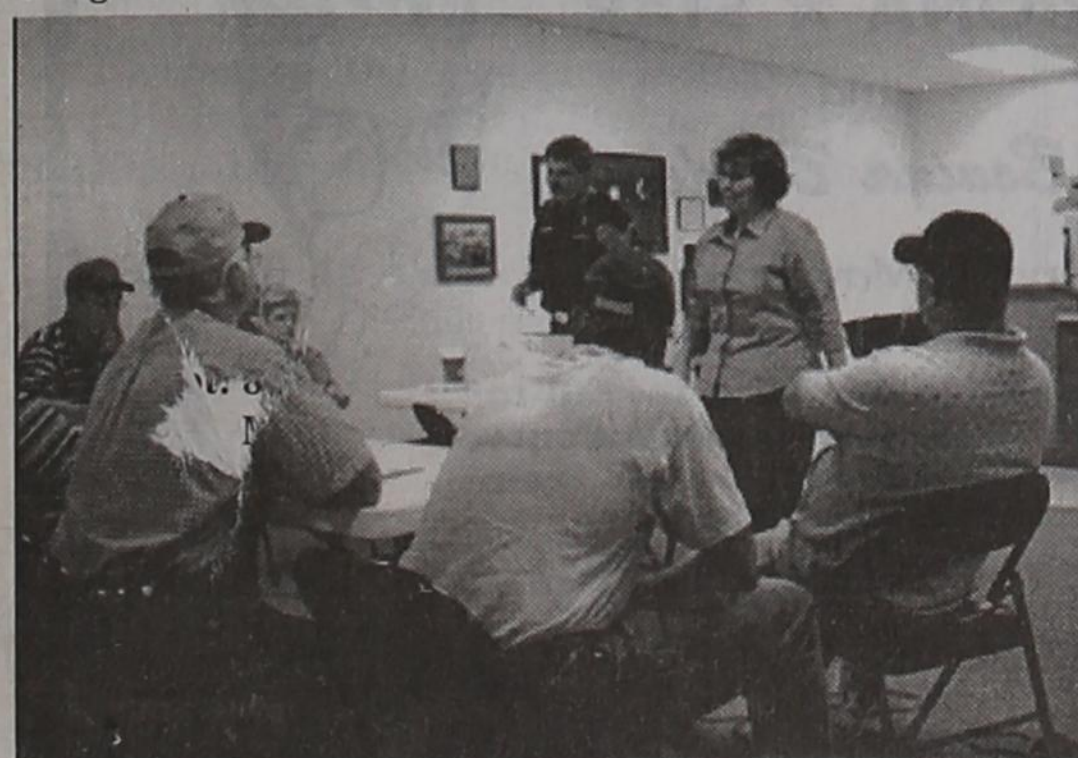
Emergency 9-1-1 calls from a cell phone show the phone number and the location of the nearest cell tower to the dispatcher. Nielsen suggested that a person calling 9-1-1 from a cell phone give their location first to the dispatcher so help can be on the way.

It was also revealed at the meeting that 9-1-1 calls from the 965-landline exchange are routed through Brownfield to the Muleshoe police department. This causes the 9-1-1 call to ring at least four times before a dispatcher answers. The delay often causes callers to hang up before the Muleshoe dispatcher answers.

Nielsen told the group that her office could reroute the calls from the 965-exchange, which is Five Area Telephone, so that 9-1-1 calls would route to Friona.

Nielsen also told the county officials that there were many phone numbers that did not have addresses listed in the 9-1-1 database. Any resident may call Pam Nielsen at 806-372-3381 to verify that their address is in the 9-1-1 database. She urges residents to do so.

A discussion was held about updating and improving radio repeater equipment to better serve citizens, especially those in the Lazbuddie area. County commissioners were present and agreed to consider any plan developed by Lazbuddie Fire & EMS, the Friona Police Department and West Texas Rural Telephone to improve communications between the departments.

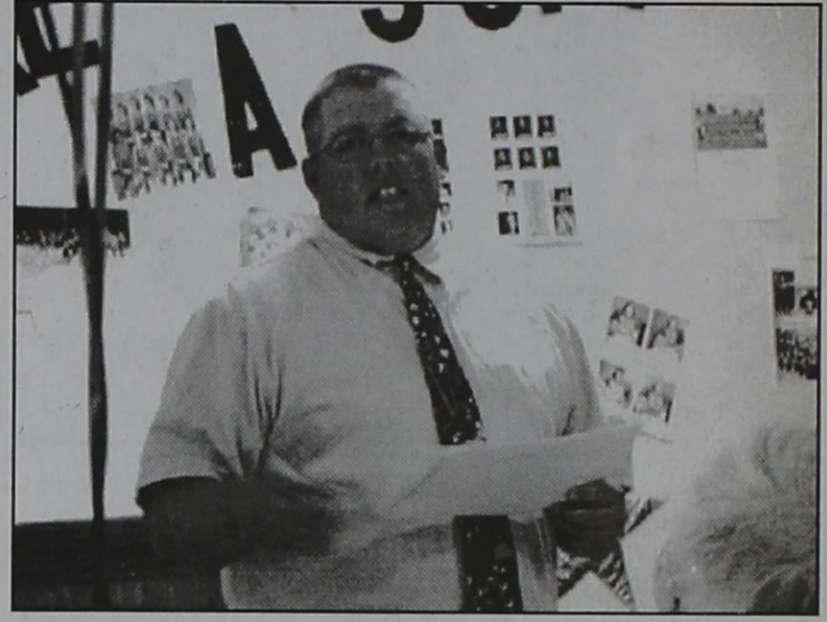
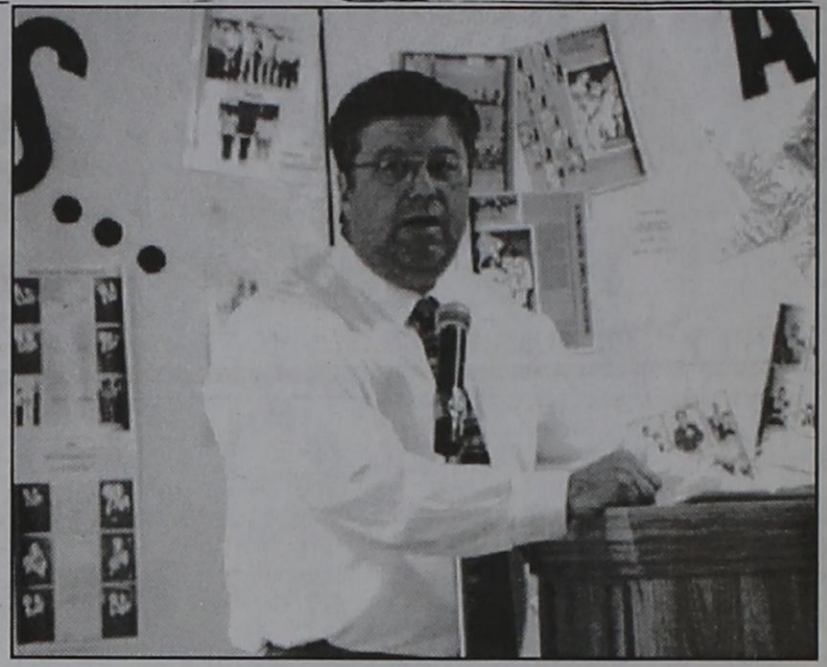

Tumbleweed Smith is producer of *The Sound of Texas*, a radio series which began in Big Spring and has become the most widely syndicated radio show in Texas.

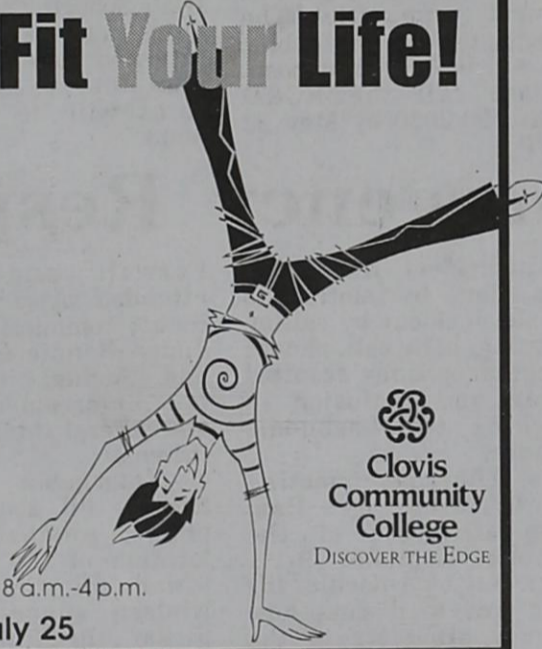

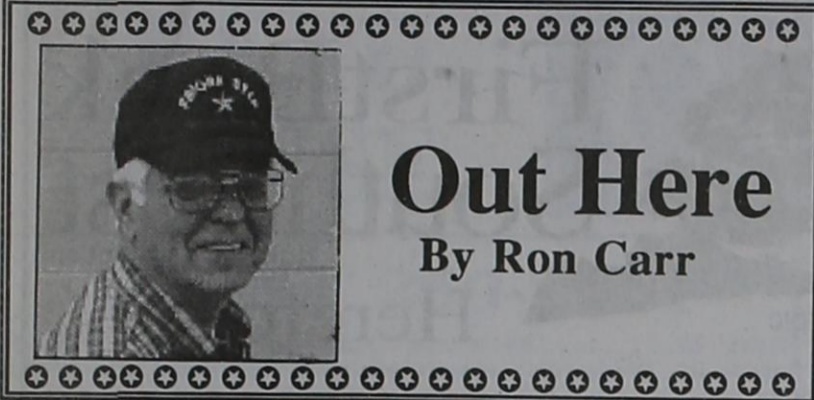

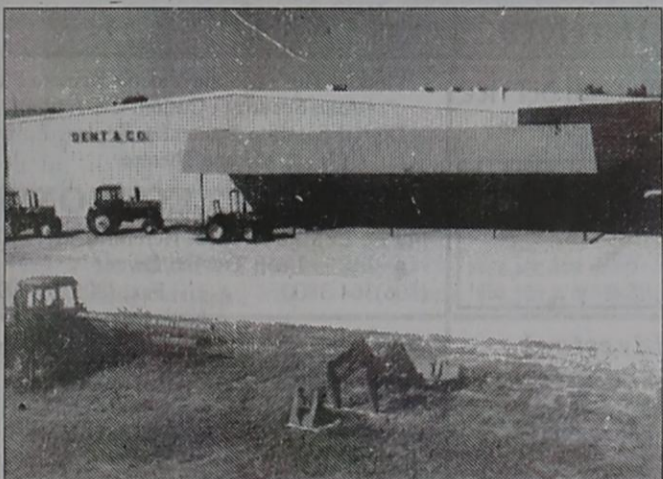

We were very poor growing up. Father was a share cropper. Mother helped in the fields. All of us children had to pick cotton. It was hard work. As I got older I had to help with the cooking, cleaning and washing. I've always worked hard.

The St. Frances River was near our home. Sometimes we got to go swimming there. In the winter when it was too cold to go outside, we would sometimes make popcorn.

At age 54, I did something I had always wanted to do. I went to school and got my GED. It was hard but I wanted to get my diploma.

I was a member of my church choir and I still love to sing. I also enjoy reading and working in the yard.


