Charlotte Ready for Taft.
Charlotte, N. C., May 19.—Everything is in readiness for the reception of President Taft, who is due to arrive here at 10 o'clock tomorrow morning. The chief executive and Mrs. Taft will be the guests of the city the entire day, and during that time the president will deliver two public addresses, the first from the reviewing stand erected in front of the court house and the second to the colored people and students of Biddle University. A public reception will be held in the evening at the Selwyn Hotel and later the visitors are expected to attend the musical festival.

The streets, public buildings, hotels, business houses and private residences throughout the city are lavishly decorated in honor of the president's visit. The three days' carnival and celebration in honor of the anniversary of the signing of the Mecklenburg declaration of independence has attracted thousands of visitors from North Carolina and neighboring States, and the outpouring tomorrow on the occasion of the president's visit will be very great.

WEATHER FORECAST.

For Wichita Falls and Vicinity: Tonight and Thursday, partly cloudy weather.

Wichita Falls, Texas, May 19th, 1922.

In the next campaign for the governorship it begins to look as if the leading issue will be local option or State-wide prohibition. The great majority of those who were formerly anti-prohibitionists, now favor local option in preference to State-wide prohibition, and those who were local optionists are now State-widers. In other words, the anti forces, seeing the handwriting on the wall, much prefer local option to State-wide prohibition, and will therefore not attempt to elect a straight out anti governor, but will most likely pick out some one of the various prominent men aspiring to the governorship who favor local option in preference to State-wide prohibition. In this connection, it is asserted that Judge M. M. Brooks is likely to be the candidate of the anti on a local option ticket while Cone Johnson will, in all probability, come out as a candidate for the governorship on a State-wide prohibition platform. There will be other candidates in the race, also. Both Colquitt and Attorney General Davidson have formally declared their intention to make the race. Both are strong men and both are anti on the prohibition question. With such a mix-up, and with no more candidates in the race, the situation looks good for Johnson, who, so far as now known, will be the only State-wide prohibition candidate in the field.

The map of the commercial secretaries shows that the assessed valuation of land in Wichita county increased from \$6.26 per acre in 1907 to \$11.40 in 1908, or \$5.14 per acre. For the same year the assessed values of land in Potter county decreased from \$3.83 in 1907 to \$2.27 per acre in 1908. None of the counties adjoining Potter show any decreases. Will the Daily Paphanle please tell us whether the free sovereigns of Potter are dodging their taxes or has there been a slump in values?

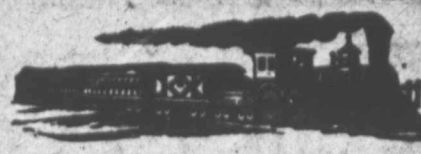

Inventory of Capitol of Texas.

Every Texan knows that Texas has a very large State capitol building, but few who have not visited Austin know just how great it is. It is one of the wonders of the world. The following instructive and interesting information was recently published in the Greenville Banner:

"A few days ago I conceived the idea of taking an inventory of the State capitol and finding Mr. Lineberger, capitol policeman, whose brother once lived near Greenville and was one of the victims of the triple tragedy near Bristol, Ellis county, a few years since, I proposed to interrogate him in regard to its vastness. I soon discovered that he was the very individual I was looking for, as he had loaded himself with the exact information I wanted.

"I learned from him that this is the only public building in the world paid for in full by real estate. The contract was consummated between the State and the Farewell syndicate of Chicago for the construction of three million acres of land of supposed value of one dollar per acre. The syndicate retained the land, subletting the contract to Gus Wilkie for four and one half million dollars. It was begun in 1882 and finished in 1888, being dedicated May 16 of said year. It is the seventeenth largest building in the world and second to none in the United States except the capitol at Washington. It is the only public building in the world whose material is all furnished by its own State. It is built entirely of Texas material. It covers three and three-fourths acres of land, an dthe distance around the building is one-third of a mile. Its length east and west is 600 feet, inside the doors 566 feet 10 inches. It has 25,000 cartons of hewn stone in its walls, 10 tons to the car, making 1,200,000 tons. It is built from granite taken from Granite mountain in Burnet county, about sixty miles north of Austin. The granite was donated to the State by the owners of the quarry, Messrs. Westfall, Lacy and Norton. It has 900 windows, 258 doors, 570 openings, 7 1/2 miles of wainscoting, floor space of 27 acres. It is the most substantial building on the North American continent. The furnishing cost \$110,000. In the governor's reception room there is a mirror of French plate glass that cost \$800. Three window curtains at \$750 each, \$2,250. The other furniture consists of chairs, tables, etc., that are made of Texas material, except that there is a marble table donated by the State of Tennessee in honor of Houston and Crockett. In this room is kept

the Texas flag which was sold at auction in New York city to W. R. Hearst for \$500,000 for the benefit of the Galveston flood sufferers. Those who have not visited the capitol can have but a vague idea of the grandeur of the building."

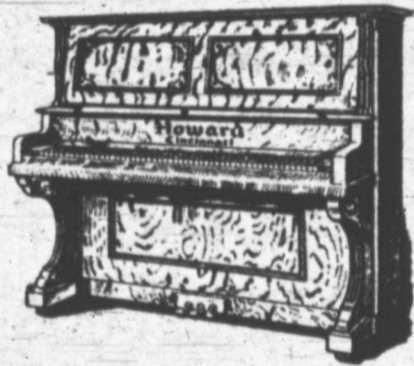

Inventory of Capitol of Texas. Every Texan knows that Texas has a very large State capitol building, but few who have not visited Austin know just how great it is. It is one of the wonders of the world. The following instructive and interesting information was recently published in the Greenville Banner:

"A few days ago I conceived the idea of taking an inventory of the State capitol and finding Mr. Lineberger, capitol policeman, whose brother once lived near Greenville and was one of the victims of the triple tragedy near Bristol, Ellis county, a few years since, I proposed to interrogate him in regard to its vastness. I soon discovered that he was the very individual I was looking for, as he had loaded himself with the exact information I wanted.

"I learned from him that this is the only public building in the world paid for in full by real estate. The contract was consummated between the State and the Farewell syndicate of Chicago for the construction of three million acres of land of supposed value of one dollar per acre. The syndicate retained the land, subletting the contract to Gus Wilkie for four and one-half million dollars. It was begun in 1882 and finished in 1888, being dedicated May 16 of said year. It is the seven-teenth largest building in the world and second to none in the United States except the capitol at Washington. It is the only public building in the world whose material is all furnished by its own State. It is built entirely of Texas material. It covers three and three-fourths acres of land, an dthe distance around the building is one-third of a mile. Its length east and west is 600 feet, inside the doors 566 feet 10 inches. It has 25,000 car-loads of hewn stone in its walls, 10 tons to the car, making 1,200,000 tons. It is built from granite taken from Granite mountain in Burnet county, about sixty miles north of Austin. The granite was donated to the State by the owners of the quarry, Messrs. Westfall, Lacy and Norton. It has 900 windows, 258 doors, 570 openings, 7 1/2 miles of wainscoting, floor space of 27 acres. It is the most substantial building on the North American continent. The furnishing cost \$110,000. In the governor's reception room there is a mirror of French plate glass that cost \$800. Three window curtains at \$750 each, \$2,250. The other furniture consists of chairs, tables, etc., that are made of Texas material, except that there is a marble table donated by the State of Tennessee in honor of Houston and Crockett. In this room is kept

the Texas flag which was sold at auction in New York city to W. R. Hearst for \$500,000 for the benefit of the Galveston flood sufferers. Those who have not visited the capitol can have but a vague idea of the grandeur of the building."

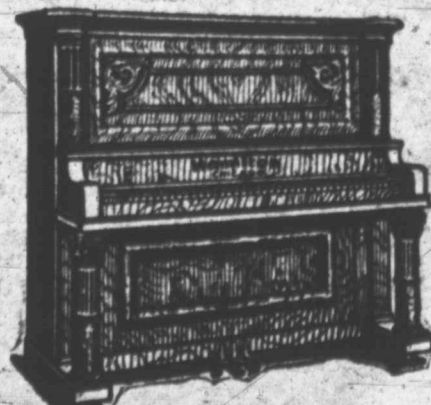

HOW TO CRACK A SAFE IS THE LATEST BOOK OUT.

New York, May 18.—Of all the literature and lore of the underworld, unearthed from time to time by the New York police, a code of instructions in the gentle art of safe cracking holds at least the record for humorous originality.

This latest contribution to yeagmen belleslettres reads like a sheet from a correspondence school on "how to blow a safe."

It was found last night in the rooms of an energetic individual in the Bronx, recorded in the rogue's gallery at No. 5000. He was detained in the hope that he may explain a recent robbery. His treasured document says among other things:

"The Knight of the Road should know this book in order to keep abreast of the times. I can give you a general knowledge of all the different kinds of safes, their platings, paddings, etc., so that once you have a practical idea of how to blow one you are thought all right. The 'burglar-proof' safe is the simplest thing in the world to get to. They are generally made in an oval tumbler, but the bolt is so constructed that you can't do it on the quiet."

Here follows a line of instructions on how "to insert the dope" and how to get into a safe. It advises against going through the back, as it is likely to be of solid material, without packing and the contents of the safe may be blown away with the explosion.

The foregoing is but a sample of the generalities.

Before concluding the writer gives minute details as to the peculiarities of safes, the amount of explosives to use and other valuable hints that no up-to-date burglar's library should be without.

New Denver Schedule.

Fort Worth Star-Telegram. The new schedule for the Fort Worth and Denver, which will cut down the time to Denver one hour and fifty-five minutes, has been completed and will become effective Sunday, June 5. In addition to cutting down the time of various trains, making everything faster, the new schedule will also extend the Texline train through to Denver.

Under the new schedule, the time of arrival and departure of the Denver trains will be as follows:

No. 1 will leave Fort Worth at 9:40 a. m. and reach Denver the next afternoon at 3:15 p. m.

No. 2 will leave Denver at 12:15 noon and arrive in Fort Worth the next afternoon at 3:15 p. m.

No. 7 will leave Fort Worth as at present, at 9:15 p. m. and arrive in Denver the second morning at 7:30 o'clock.
