If your taste runs to real estate, Ultra Magazine features in its December edition five homes in the Dallas area, priced from \$535,000 to \$1,700,000. The homes range from brand new, to over 30 years old, for those not wanting to have to put in their own lawn.

For the honest-to-goodness Texan, there is available a gold-plated watch in the shape of the state. There are no numerals on the watch. The illustration shows the time to be about "Ten minutes before Houston." We wouldn't recommend this gift for relatives outside our

Republic's borders. For the romantically inclined, Ultra offers a picnic basket for two, with everything from caviar on toast to a raspberry wine cake, a bottle of wine and privately-blended coffee. This gift advertised at \$250 delivered, but this may not mean to Parmer County.

"Sharper Image," in its new holiday issue, features a number of gadgets, for those so inclined. Among the items is the "Censorview," a computerized mechanism which allows you to program your TV set so your child may not watch a particular show. Of course, you may opt to just monitor the schedule, and save the \$200.

Also available is a three-piece suit of armour, right out of the 15th centruy. Comes complete with a matching sword, and priced right at \$2450.00. This item requires six to eight weeks for delivery, so scratch it for this Christmas.

"Ultra" had one other item which caught my eye:, an 1877 U.S. threedollar Indian gold piece in proof condition. This would be a collector's dream, since there were only 20 such coins minted that year. Also, due to the scarcity, the price was not quoted. But after all, if you have to ask the price....

Memorials Handy For Equipment

Have you ever tried to use a stethoscope? If you have, you know that the beat of the heart is not easy to hear, even when conditions are very quiet. Now, imagine using one on the side of the highway with people standing around talking and cars passing by. Or perhaps, think of listening in the back of a truck bouncing over a dirt road.

These are situations faced by ambulance personnel when trying to hear a pulse or take blood pressure after an accident, for the ambulance, no matter how well equipped, is still a truck at heart.

Because of the difficulties in using a stethoscope under noisy condition, Bovina Ambulance Service recently purchased an electronic stethoscope from money given as a memorial to C.R. Elliott. The new piece of equipment amplifies the heartbeat or sounds picked up by the bell of the stethoscope and makes it possible to better monitor a patient's vital signs under adverse conditions.

The memorial fund is a source of money for special projects, equipment that makes the attendants' job easier or more exact than it might be with standard equipment.

No amount of special equipment can replace well-trained crew members. For that reason, the Bovina Ambulance Service will teach an Emergency Medical Technician's course beginning in January. This class is necessary for ambulance crew members, but it also will help those who just want to know what to do when an emergency arises at home or on the highway.



The Foster Parent Association of Parmer, Castro and Deaf Smith Counties is now making preparations for Christmas for the foster children of these counties.







Around The House In Parmer County

The holidays are fast approaching and you may be trying to find some new recipes to try for families and friends. The following recipes are quick to fix and would ship well if you mail gifts. In pretty containers, they would also make nice

These are basically, seasoned nuts, and would be. good to have around the house anytime. Remember, nuts provide protein and are worthwhile sources of magnesium.

CARMELIZED ALMONDS 1 cup slivered almonds 1/4 cup sugar

Combine nuts and sugar in small skillet. Stir constantly and rapidly as the sugar begins to turn color. Remove from heat when almonds are caramel-colored and spread on greased cookie sheet. Break apart when crisp.

BARBECUED PECANS 1 tablespoon butter or margarine

1/3 teaspoon tabasco sauce 2 cups pecans

1/2 cup worcestershire sauce 1/4 teaspoon garlic salt

Heat butter over low heat; add pecans and parch slightly; adding 1 tablespoon sauce and salt mixture slowly until completely parched. **ORANGE PECANS**

1 tablespoon grated orange rind

1/4 cup orange juice 1/2 cup sugar 2 cups pecans

Combine orange rind, juice, and sugar in saucepan. Bring to a rapid boil. Add pecans and stir constantly over high heat until all syrup is absorbed. Remove from heat and stir until pecans have separated. Turn out

onto cookie sheet to cool. SUGAR & SPICE NUTS

1 tablespoon butter or margarine, melted 1 egg white, slightly beaten 2 cups unroasted almonds, English walnuts and/or pecans

1 cup sugar 1/2 teaspoon salt 11/2 teaspoons cinnamon 3/4 teaspoon nutmeg

3/4 teaspoon allspice

Preheat oven to 300 degrees. Slowly stir melted fat into beaten egg white. Stir in nuts. Mix sugar and spices. Spread about 1/4 of the sugar mixture in a 10x15 inch shallow baking pan. Coat a few nuts at a time in remaining sugar mixture, and arrange in the pan. Sprinkle rest of sugar mixture over nuts. Bake 15 to 20 minutes, or until nuts are lightly browned. Remove nuts from oven; stir gently to separate nuts. Cool. Store in

tightly closed container. **PARMESAN PEANUTS** 2 tablespoons salad oil 1 pound salted peanuts

1 teaspoon garlic salt 2 tablespoons grated

Parmesan cheese Heat oil in flat baking pan in 350 degree oven about 5 minutes. Remove from oven. add peanuts and stir until coated with hot oil. Return to oven for about 5 minutes. Remove from oven, sprinkle with Parmesan cheese and garlic salt and stir to coat with cheese. Cool and serve.



FIRST AID FOR EYE INJURIES

Roming is an agriculture education major and is classified as a junior this year. He is a graduate of Bovina High School.




