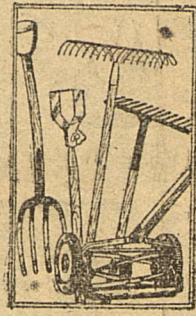
BRYANT-LINK STORE ROBBED AND BURNED AT LUEDERS

ONE TERM FOR PRESIDENT AND GOVERNS

Politics and scandals seem to be the main topics of discussion in the newspapers of today, and politics will continue to be the chief topic of interest until after the elections next November. That being the case, it is in line with the trend of thought to refer to suggested constitutional amendments which would undoubtedly relieve our presidents and State governors of a great deal of political worry and leave them free to conduct the affairs of their office without fear or favor. The suggested amendments call for a single term of six years for President, and in case of States, one term of four years.

Under our present system, there is no legal limit to the number of terms a President or a Governor can serve. By common consent, two terms are considered sufficient for any man, but to secure two terms means that most of the first term is given over to preparation of the next campaign. Appointments are often made because of political influence and for political consideration, not because the man had the qualifications necessary to fill the position creditably. It often becomes necessary to give more time to politics than to business of the Government, and no doubt the President as well as the Governors frequently indorse legislation from

the standpoint of party consideration instead of following their own personal judgment.

One term of six years would give a president an opportunity to serve the people to the best of his ability without regard to party consideration. A term of four years for the Governor would drive politics out of the Governor's office.—Farm & Ranch.

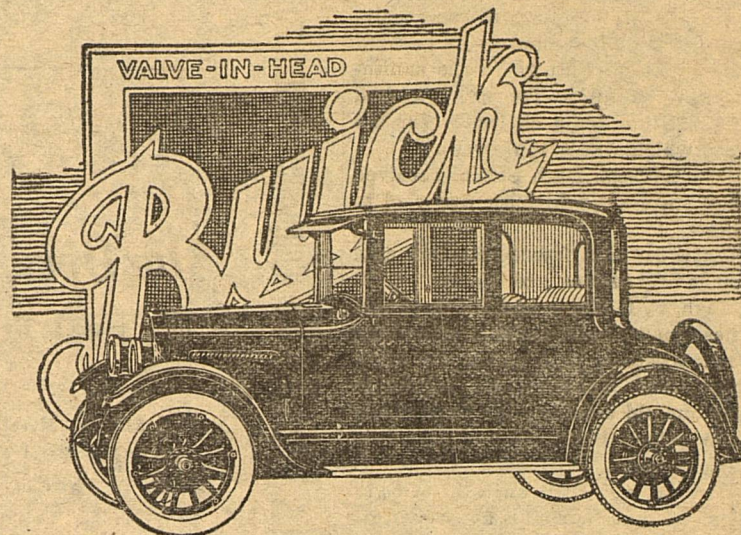
