Finding Solutions to Our Water Problem

| $S_{\text {water }}^{\text {ometimes it seems like our }}$ weather: Everyone talks about it but no one does anything. However, the truth is there are many fine people working on the problem; they just need more help. <br> People are finding solutions at the High Plains Underground Water Conservation District, the U.S.D.A. Department of Soil Conservation, the Plant and Water Stress Center and the Water Research Center at Texas Tech University, just to name a few. This week I'd like to share with you some of the things they're working on. <br> Much of the research involves finding ways to increase the recharge of the Ogallala AquiferMost of our rainfall evaporates before it ever reaches the aquifer, so experiments have been conducted to route rainfall directly to the aquifer through a face. Unfortunately, in the past, these holes soon became clogged with debris. Recently, new filters have been developed that can eliminate this problem. It is esti- | mated that this technology could extend the li ten percent. <br> A large amount of the recharge is through the many playas that lie over the Ogallala. And there's a new development that could increase this flow. Experiments are being done with knot grass, a species that can grow on the bottom of the playas. Its roots make an excellent conduit for recharge. These experiments have also led to what could be a significant side benefit. Knot grass has a high enough protein content to support one and a half animals per acre. With 17,000 playas averaging 22 acres each, this means mals could be supported on the High Plains. <br> Since almost half our rainfall is in small increments (less than $25 / 100$ inch) which evaporates quickly, any method that can reduce evaporation will have a great impact on our water supply. ## Texans Spending More For Schools

Texans increased spending on
local public schools by $\$ 552$ million last year, as trustees in
1,069 school districts adopted school budgets totaling $\$ 9.0$
billion. That provided more than $\$ 200$ in additional funds for each of the $2,727,512$ students in the
state, according to the Texas Research League.
Local property taxpayers were million to pay for the increase. The in state and federal aid programs and by higher local fees.
The figures come from the latest issue of Bench Marks for 1984-85 School District Budgets in Texas,
an annual publication of the Texas an annual publication of the Texas
Research League, an Austinbased, educational corporation engaged in governmental research. School budgets adopted for
1983-84 called for spending $\$ 2,713$ er student for current operations Bovina ISD's budget provided for
$\$ 2834.71$ per student based on the 476 students in average daily attendance in 1982-83.
Four of five of these dollars
were spent for salaries. Statewide, payroll expense averaged $\$ 2,153$ per student, as compared to $\$ 2112$ combination of salary levels and staffing patterns.
