



Later on, after Mrs. Ferguson is elected, a contest could be started to prevent her taking her seat as Governor. Under the authorities cited by the Ferguson counsel only the Legislature would be the judge of her eligibility. However, action in the courts, as in the present case, could be started with a view of having the court decide whether they have jurisdiction and if so whether or not a woman is qualified to hold

the office of Governor. Oct. 4 is the last day the Secretary of State can certify names to go on the official ballot and that is two days before the appellate court convenes. That leaves but a limited time within which to print and distribute the official ballots before Nov. 4. It is known that most of the counties will print the official ballots immediately upon receiving the last certificates from the Secretary of State, which will be Oct. 6. Oct. 4 is Saturday and mail will have ample time during Sunday, the 5th, to reach nearly every part of Texas and be delivered on Monday, the 6th. That means the ballots will be printed for the most part while the appeal is under way, but before it can be finally

Coming to the most important point involved in the injunction suit, the ninteenth amendment to the Con- lor.

stitution of the United States, giving women the rights of suffrage, it also conferred upon them the right to hold office, and it was not necessary for the enacting enabling acts to make the holding of office by them legal.

He referred to the fifteenth amendment which gave negroes citizenship and the right to vote. In the South during reconstruction days negroes under the fifteenth amendment voted and held office. Nobody raised the question as to their eligibility to hold office.

But now the question is raised as to the right of white women to hold office under the ninteenth suffrage amendment. It was held that the common law of England, which enters strongly in plaintiff's suit, was almost obsolete in this country, so numerous have the changes in it been made in the progress of civilization. There is a common law in Texas, made so by custom, and that custom has for several years been that women can hold office. Many of them have held office and many are now holding office. Their right to hold these offices has never been questioned until now.

In the opinion of the court it was the intent of the framers of the Texas Constitution not to disbar women from holding office in the future for the reason that nowhere in the instrument is it said that holders of office shall be males. An amendment which the framers of the Constitution rejected, proposed that office holders be confined to males. This act, Judge Calhoun said, convinced him that it was not the intention of the Constitutionframers to prohibit the holding of office by women.

As the use of "he" and "his" in the Constitution with reference to As the use of "he" and "his" in the holding of office, Judge Calhoun said that these same words are used in the Bill of Rights, and no one would argue that women under the Bill of Rights have not the same protection as men. 




