



> The Public School is ARMER PAYS FOR ALL STRIKES There are several points in connection with the threatened strike of the hard coal miners that our folks should understand closely.

The first is that hard coal prices are already too high. Unless miners' wages are reduced or cost cut down in some other way, users of anthracite should turn to wood, oil. coke or semibituminous.

The second is that railroad unions are planning to strike for higher wages, as soon as the public gets nervous and excited enough over the coal situation.

The third and most important is that every increase in costs in the mines or on the railroads comes chiefly out of the ockets of the farmers. Do not think for a moment that the mine owners, the railroads, or city people in general, pay these higer wages. They do not have to.

The method is complex, and its operation is sometimes slow. Nevertheless it is true that when the city man has to pay a dollar more for coal or a railroad ticket, he gets that dollar either by adding to the price of the merchandise he sells the farmers, or by taking it out of what he pays for bread, milk, aples or potatoes.





The arrival of the French debt mission in the United States this week is of great significance.

By sending her finance minister over to discuss a pact, France definitely and for all time accepts moral responsibility and the obligation for the debt, even if the future has to find the terms. All of which is quite different from showing a disposi-

tion to not pay at all. If a settlement can be worked out it will be followed by one with Italy and a great gain will be securedeventually at least-for the American taxpayers, who have been carrying the load of the foreign debts.

The American debt commission is expected to ask only for such terms of payment as France can reasona-French prosperity, which exists in contrast to British depression, and on French taxes.
