E. L. Caraway Inaugu- Jayton Boy Gives Life in an Attempt to Save Boy From Drowning

Saturday afternoon of last week William Earl Lowrance, 17 years eld son of Mr. and Mrs. O. C. Lowrance, of Jayton, gave his life in saving Jack Wade, a twelve years old boy, from drowning in the railroad lake. In accord with the story told by boys present, the Wade boy was swimming across the lake, and becoming exhausted appealed for help. Young Lowrance swam to him and guided him to near the Dr. Nichols Will Spend bank of the lake, when he, too, then became exhausted. Lowrance pushed the boy as far as possible toward the bank, giving up and sinking to the bottom of the lake. Boys on the bank caught the smaller boy and rescued him, but upon reaching the Lowrance boy all efforts were unavailing in an attempt to revive him.

The remains of young Lowrance were interred Monday in the Jayton cemetery. He was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. Lowrance, and Jayton people are in accord in stating that he was one of the finest young men of the town, and the fact that he gave his own life in an endeavor to save another, is evidence that he was "a boy among boys."



About Birth Control and National Society

Editor Texas Spur:

I wish to bring before your readers a few points on the subject of Birth Controll, for the time has come that whatever personal views we may take as to the desirability of birth controll, we are no longer faced with the question, shall we allow it or not? It is here now. We can we cannot stop it. Statistics show that College graduates, when they marry, have few children, many of them, no children. Does this mean that higher education reduces fertilof 1893, in Chicago, they all met as ity? Indeed it does not. It means that the prosptrous class are provided with Birth Controll information forbidden to the poor.

A poll of the memberes of Congress show an average of one and one half children apiece. Apparently they are practicing the principle Control League, whether they ad mit it or not. Now for a pen picture of the other side. The federal childrens' bureau has published some score of careful investigations into the conditions surrounding mothers and children in the United States. Those who read these reports will find they are often shocking. The bureau admits them to be shocking and where they are most terrible three things always go together: there is too little income, too little knowledge, and too many children. The advice given is pathetic. If we can only no away with this squalid overty with this fearful ignorance they say, the millennium will come On the third point they are silent. The cause of this situation in the U. S. A. is the federal law passed through the efforts of Anthony Comstock, with the practical effect of making it a crime to advise any method of limiting the family. To be sure it is a dead letter for the majority of the educated and well to do. Judged by the size of their families, it is broken with impunity by the hypocrite who defends it, the lawyer who refuses to repeal it, and hold it-but the poor suffer for it. It is proper for one of our scientific agriculture to give directions for growing prize winning corn by spacing the plants correctly, but improper for the government bureau which deals with mere humanbeings to give directions. The childrens bureau is free to give endless information to poverty stricken mothers about baby feeding and pre-natal care, but it can not tell her how to space her babies correctly. Oh, the irony of such instructions under the circumstances. It is time the government bureau should begin the study of how raise prize winning babies as well as corn, and make it possible for all who want this information to have it. Repeal this law that is already a dead letter to the favored class and extend help to the poor as well. This is what the American Birth Control League is trying to do and it is up to the press to spread this news just as every other question si brought before the people.-Mrs. J. A. 


