SINCE BOVINA is playing six-man football this year, we asked Coach Terry Bean to help us out on the differences in six-man rules and eleven-man play.

He sent us the following, and we thought we would share it with others who might be interested:

TEXAS SIX-MAN FOOTBALL RULES

Texas Six-Man Football Rules are the same as for the eleven-man game except for the following variations:

1. Offense must advance 15 yards instead of 10 in four downs.
2. Each team has six players. Unless necessary to use the eleven-man field, the six-man field is 80 yards by 40 yards, with the 40 yard line at center of the field. Goal posts are 25 feet apart and the crossbar is 9 feet above the ground.
3. Unless the ball is kicked or forward passed, it may not be advanced across the line of scrimmage until after an exchange has been made between the receiver of the snap and another player. If a forward pass is thrown to the snapper, it must travel at least one yard in flight.
4. Length of quarter: 10 minutes; between quarters: 2 minutes; between halves: 15 minutes.
5. The ball must travel 15 yards on a kickoff or free kick following a safety or be touched by the receiving team before members of the kicking team are eligible to touch it.
6. Kick-off is made from kicker's 30 yard line on a six-man field and there must be at least 3 players from the receiving team between the receiving team's 35 and 30 yard lines (between 15 and 20 yards from the ball).
7. At least 3 team A players shall be on their line of scrimmage at the snap. (See Rule 7 of the NCAA Football Rules and Interpretations Book.)
8. Ball may be handed in any direction to any player during a scrimmage down behind the line of scrimmage.
9. If a fumble occurs before there has been an exchange or pass and if a player of A recovers it, he may not carry it beyond the line.
10. The ball is dead when a passer catches his own pass and it is ruled as an incomplete forward pass.
11. All players are eligible to catch a forward pass, except that a pass is ruled incomplete when caught by the passer (Rule 10).
12. Field goal counts 4 points; try-for point, 2 points if successful through place or drop-kick and 1 point if successful by pass or scrimmage.
13. When one team is 45 points or more ahead at the end of the first half or secures such a lead during the second half, the game is ended immediately.
14. The team whose goal line is involved shall put the ball in play by a snap on their 20 yard line after a touchback and by a kick-off or punt on their 20 yard line after a safety.
15. The 20 yard line will be used as a penetration line.
16. If the player receiving the snap advances beyond the line of scrimmage without an exchange, the penalty will be five yards plus loss of down (illegal procedure).

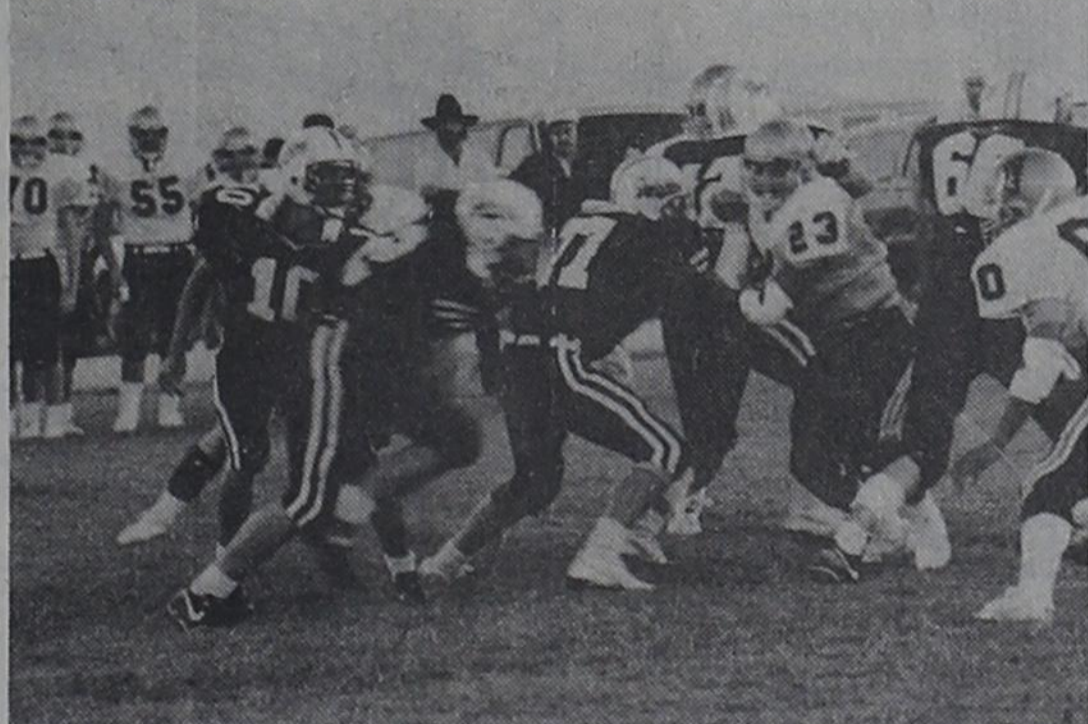

TO JAYTON

Mustangs Drop 22-18 Game In Opener

Bovina High School's Mustangs were initiated into the world of six-man football by a tough Jayton team Saturday night at Smyer. Jayton scored a 22-18 win, the margin being on point-after conversions.

The Mustangs, who have been rated in the state's top ten teams by pre-season experts in six-man circles, definitely showed they have the talent, but some untimely mistakes on opening night cost them the win.

Denver Riddle gave the Mustangs the early lead by running the ball over from seven yards out in the first quarter, for a 6-0 Bovina lead. A running try for points failed.

Riddle was back in action in the second quarter, this time going 55 yards for the score as the Mustangs upped their advantage to 12-0.

Jayton bounced back with a 13-yard run by Morales, and then a four-yard pass from Stanaland to Martinez. A good kick after the second touchdown gave the Jaybirds a 14-12 halftime lead. (Extra point kicks are worth two points in six-man.)

In the third quarter, Jayton's Shafer scored on a one-yard run, and the kick gave Jayton a 22-12 lead.

Riddle got his third touchdown of the game in the fourth quarter, on a 15-yard pass from Sudderth, and the kick was blocked. That

turned out to be the final margin, 22-18.

Riddle was the leading ground-gainer for Bovina with 102 yards on 15 carries, and Bud Venable added 38 on eight attempts.

Group Is Selling Jackets

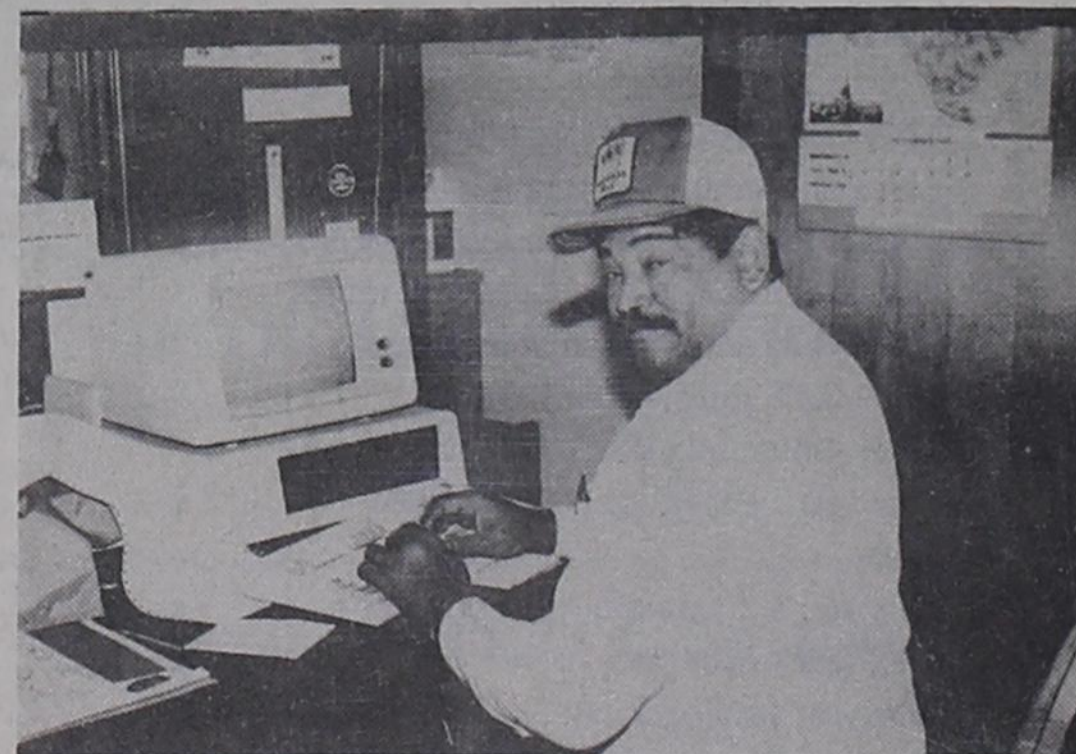
The Junior High cheerleaders are selling maroon and white Mustang jackets. Jacket sales began Monday, September 5 and end Tuesday, September 13.

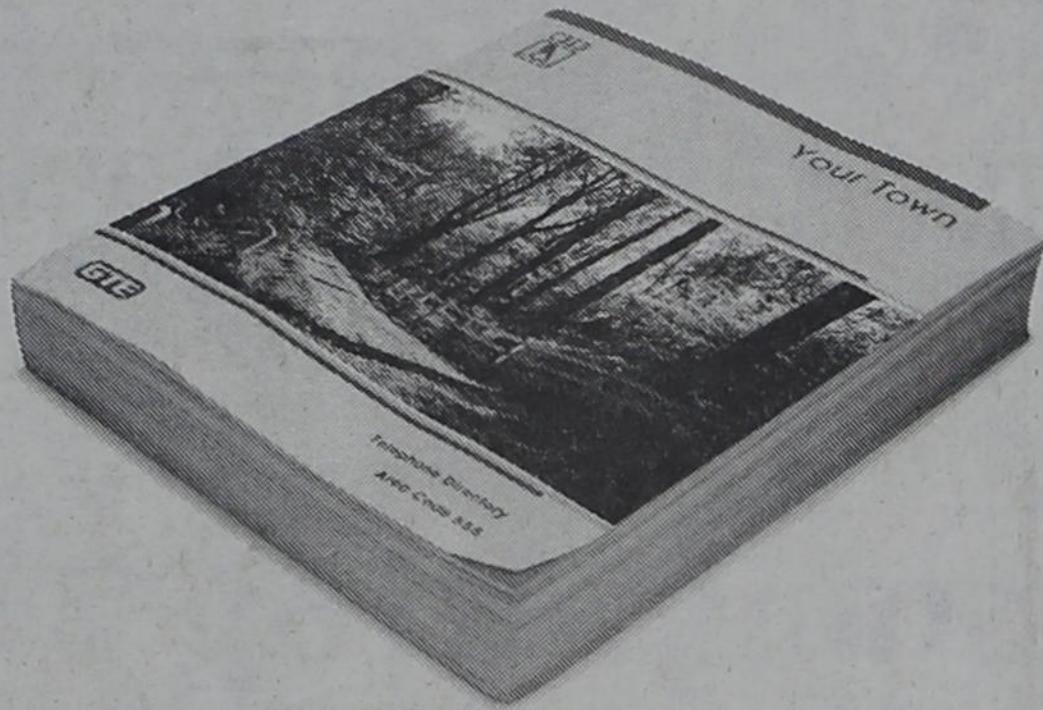

1988 Property Tax Rates in Bovina ISD

This notice concerns 1988 property tax rates for Bovina ISD. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. Compare it to the tax rate the taxing unit proposes for this year. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

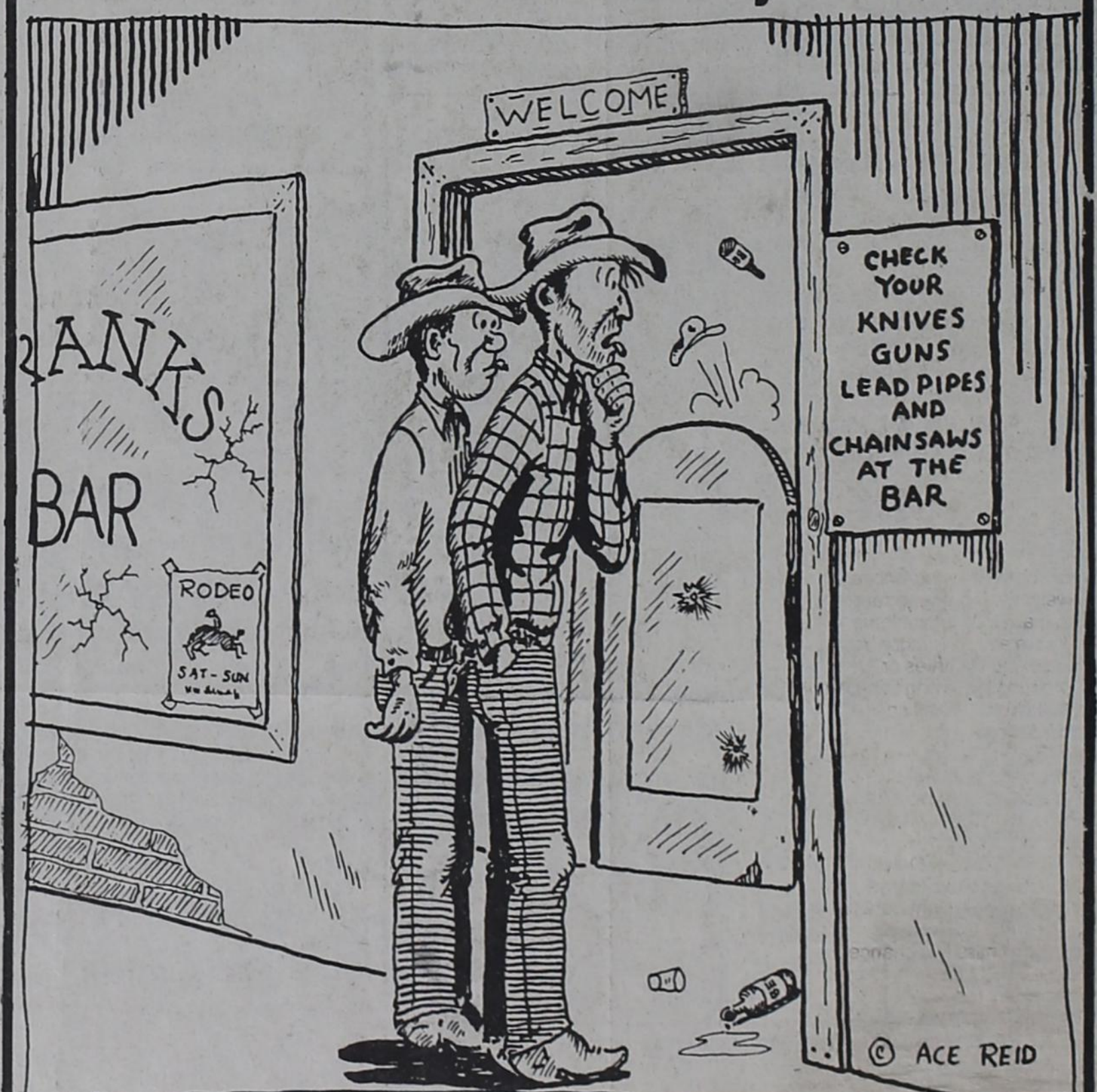
