FOOTBALL RULES Texas Six-Man Football Rules
are the same as for the eleven-man game except for the following variations:

1. Offense must advance 15 yards instead of 10 in four downs.

## 1988 Property Tax Rates in Bovina ISD

This notice concerns 1988 property tax rates for Bovina ISD. It presents information abou three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine propert taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year i for this year. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments a required by state law. The rates are given per $\$ 100$ of property value
