



The Mustangs had a 58-42 lead at the end of the third quarter.

In a game here December 30, the Mustangs scored their second win of the season over House, N.M. by a score of 107-56.

The Mustangs' scoring "fell off" to 21 points in the second quarter. Seven players shared in the scoring, paced by Riddle's six points. Bovina went to intermission with a 52-19 lead.
