NWTH take information and an ambulance rolling. An EMS dispatcher remains on the line with the caller to offer assistance, such as instructions on how to clear an obstructed ai
form CPR.
Among communities that count on the NWTH communications enter for ambulance dispatching are Amarillo, Canyon, Borger, Texline, Pampa, White Deer, Panhandle, Claude, Lake Tanglewood, Waysid County is handled through loca emergency agencies.
Radio equipment is currently being replaced or upgraded in some Panhandle locations to improve Jay Green, WT Services sales

The PEMSS originated in the 1970s when the Panhandle Re gional Planning Commission saw he need for a uniform EMS system the Panhandie. PRPC received ederal grant to help put EMS in ceeived ambulances fitted with the necessary radio equipment.
Some ambulance services are sill using essentially the same equipment nearly 20 years later.
Green says that if federal grants are provided, PEMSS might replace its present radios with a new, highproject. "This would give PEMSS clear channels. They could trasmit data, and use microwave links that would allow running video. Such capability could put a doctor in
