

Troubles in Several War Breeding Regions Revive Peace Plans

Washington, July 15 .- The most definite move toward world peace since Locarno, reflected this week indications that fourteen leading nations to accept the Kellogg-Briand treaty against agressive warfare, was marred by the flaring of old grudges in several war breeding regions.

The antiwar pact is still far from final signature. Only three nations, Germany, France and Italy, have delivered their replies to Washington but for the first time since Foreign Minister Briand proposed a Franco-American friendship agreement and Secretary Kellogg counoutlawing war the end of long di-Italy has accepted Secretary Kelciation of war as an instrument of national policy, a note containing the Italian Government's acceptance being received Sunday at the State Department.
