

ained by the Board of mers of the City of Spur,

Sectin 1. Hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person to throw place, or deposit on the ground outside any building, within the fire limits of the city, any loose paper trash, or combustible material, or to burn any such materials in the open, unless same is securely inclosed in metal wire or iron receptables

Section 2. Any person violating any provisions of the foregoing Section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon donviction shall be fined in any sum not exceeding One hundred (\$100.00) dollars.
