

ORDER OF THE COMMIS-SIONER'S COURT DECLAR-ING THE RESULT OF PROHIBITION ELECTION.

Whereas on the fourteenth day of September 1903, the Commissioner's court of Nacogdoches county passed the following order to wit:

"Nacogdoches, Texas, Sept. 14, 1903.

This day the court met in spenal session, all members being present, and proceeded to open the polls, and count the votes of an election held throughout Nacogdoches county Texas, on the 3rd day of September 1903, for the purpose of determining whether or not the sale of intoxicating liquors should be prohibited in said county, and it appearing to the court that said election was held in conformity to the laws of the state of Texas, and the court having counted the votes, find that seventeen hundred and thirty six votes were cast "For Prohibition," and that seven hundred and ninety five votes were cast "Againt Prohibition," and that a majority of the votes are "For Prohibition;" it is therefore declared by the court and so ordered that the sale of intoxicating liquors is absolutely prohibited in said Nacogdoches county, except for the purposes, and under the regulations specified in the laws of the State of Texas, until such time as the qualified voters of said county of J C Fall, of Chireno, is in Nacogdoches, may at a legal election held for that purpose by a majority vote decide otherwise."

> Therefore I, Robert Berger, County Judge of Nacogdoches county, Texas, do hereby certify that the foregoing is a true and correct copy of said order passed by the Commissioner's court, as aforesaid and that after the publication of the same for four successive weeks, in the Nacogdoches Sentinel, a weekly newspa-per published in Nacogdoches county, said order shall then be in full force and effect.
