

In 1875 the people of Tex as adopted a new constitution, That constitution gave the people of any county, precinct or other political subdivision of the county the right to prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors within the limits of the given territory, and made it the duty of the Legislature to enact laws to put that provision of the constitution into eftect. This constitution has been several times amended and many unsuccessful atamend it. The Local Option clause remains just the same that it was when the constitution was adopted. But never has any political party promulgated a declaration favorable to overthrowing the Local Option provision of our State constitution. 
