Dr.W. S. Fall Gets a Fine H

Feet. From Thursday's Daily: Dr. W. S. Fall, of Stewart, Rusk county, was in the city last night on his return from a week's trip to his old home at Chireno on business. He still owns property in Chireno and has a joint interest in the old Parks place, upon which he has been making some improvements, among them be ing the cleaning out and deep ening of an old well. This well was not producing water and it was decided to dig it deeper. To do this several teet of rock had to be blasted out, and while blasting in the rock a vein of oil was discover ed. The flow of oil was sufficient, the doctor reports, to rise and stand about three feet deep in the well. There is not a drop of water in the well, he says, and he can draw oil out by letting down a bucket just like we draw water. He has a lot of the rock that came out of the well, which he is going to exhibit at Dallas, which place he will
