ONE OF OUR Ellis cousins, Linda Patton, lives in Chehalis, Washington, and gave us a first-hand report by telephone this week of the Mt. St. Helens volcano eruption and the aftermath, which has been much in the news this week.

Linda lives at Chehalis, Washington, which is just 38 miles northeast of the volcano. No one is allowed to go farther west than her town.

Linda said that she was monitoring her ham radio on Sunday, when she heard a broadcast by a man on the mountain. The man said "It's about to blow!"

She and her family went out into their yard, and had a ringside seat for the "volcano show." Sunday was a sunny, clear day in the area, which made the sight even more impressive.

"The television pictures just don't do it justice," Linda told us. "When we saw that dark blue-grey cloud coming up out of the mountain, it gave you an eerie feeling, like it might be the end of the world," she said.

The cloud, which experts said rose nine miles high and was 35 miles wide, gave off flashes of lightning as it rose into the air, due to the tremendous heat from the volcano.

Linda said that a number of people, including sight-seers, tourists and adventurers, were in the area at the time of the eruption. People had been warned not to go too near the mountain, but went anyway, and a number suffered burns, and of course, several deaths have resulted.

The ham radio broadcaster which Ms. Patton heard is presumed dead, as is Harry Truman, the old recluse who had lived all his life on the mountain.

She was pointing out how much the appearance of Mt. St. Helens has changed since the volcanic activity this spring. It has gone from a pointed top to a "flat top," and has lost 1300 feet in height since the activity began.

Linda said that they had been fortunate from the standpoint of not getting the volcanic ash which much of that area received. The prevailing wind carried it west, and away from their home. The ash has killed all of the fish in the river which runs close to where they live, however.

Our informant said that some residents of the area had bottled up some of the volcanic ash, and were sending it out to residents in other parts of the country as souvenirs of the volcano.

"Since the wind has carried the ashes all across the country, it appears that a number of people will be getting souvenirs of the volcano by 'air mail,'" Ms. Patton said.

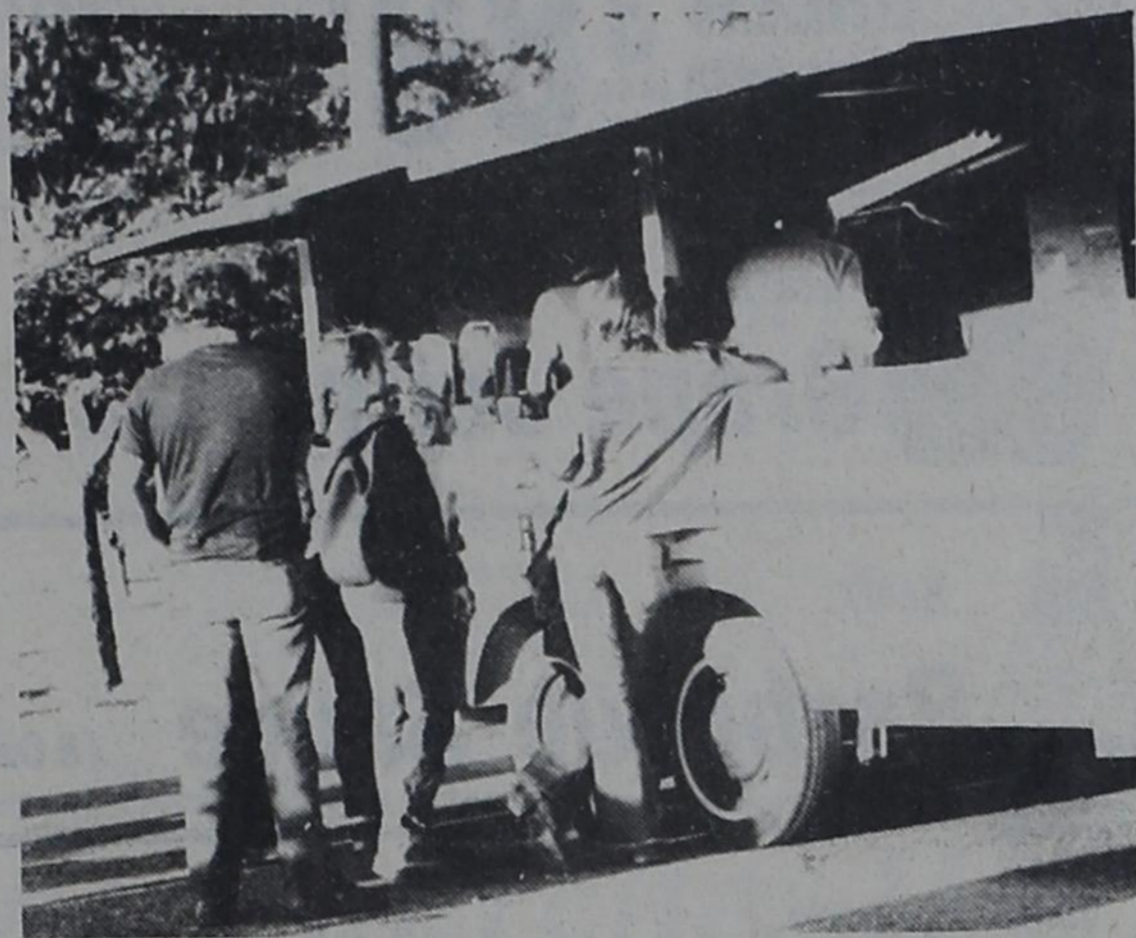
Scooter Russell returned this week from Idaho where she has been with her daughters, Tracy and Janie. The area where the girls live has not been adversely affected by the volcano, but they have heard a lot of stories by motorists who come into Mountain Home.

One thing which the people who live in the affected areas have complained about is having to spend so much time indoors. "Everyone is getting 'cabin fever,'" was Scooter's report.

Some have wondered why people continue to stay in the area close to the volcano, but they explain that the area is their home, many have lived there always, and it's tough to just pull up stakes and leave.

"Oh, no," the driver answered quickly. "He doesn't need one. I do all the driving myself."

Webb has been active in civic affairs. He is currently a board member on the Chamber of Commerce, and is a former city councilman.

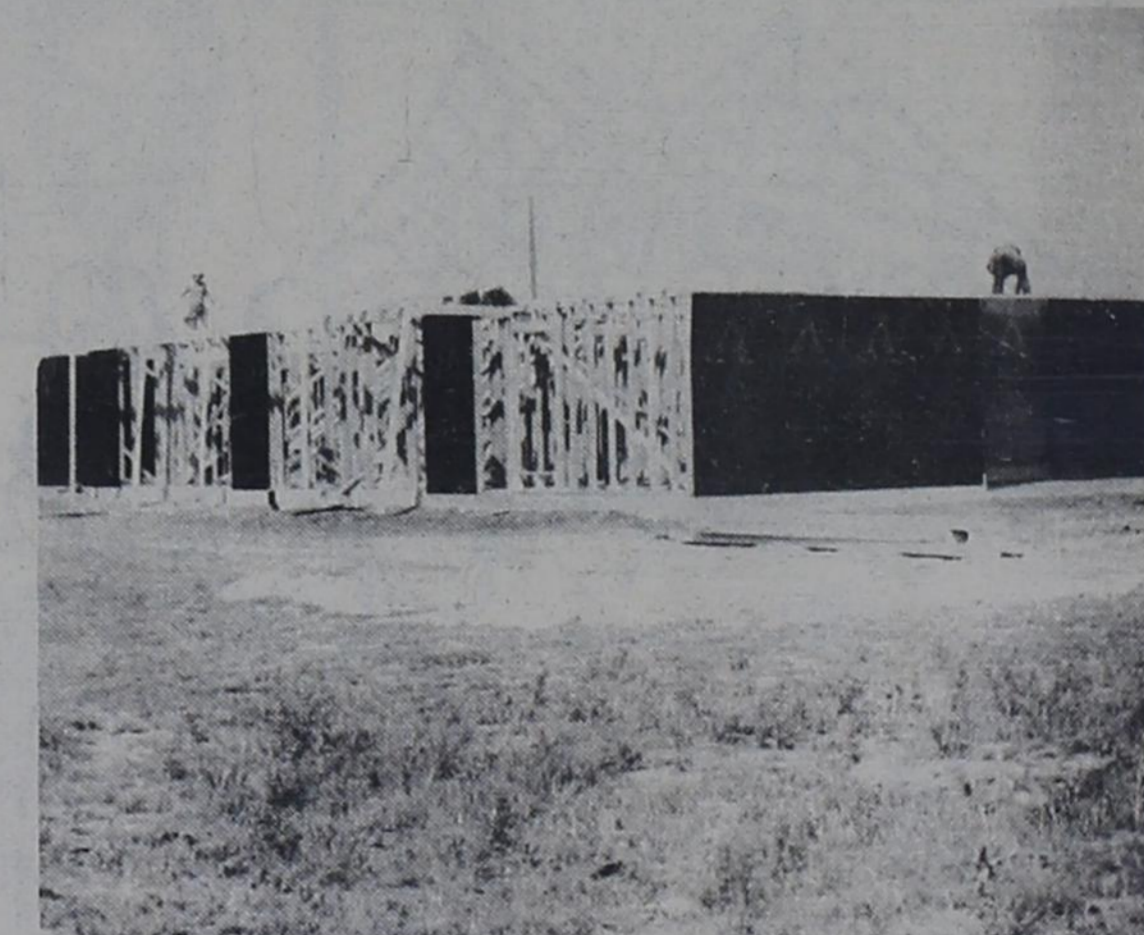

Mark Clayton and Randee Cuyit will combine to give the class history.

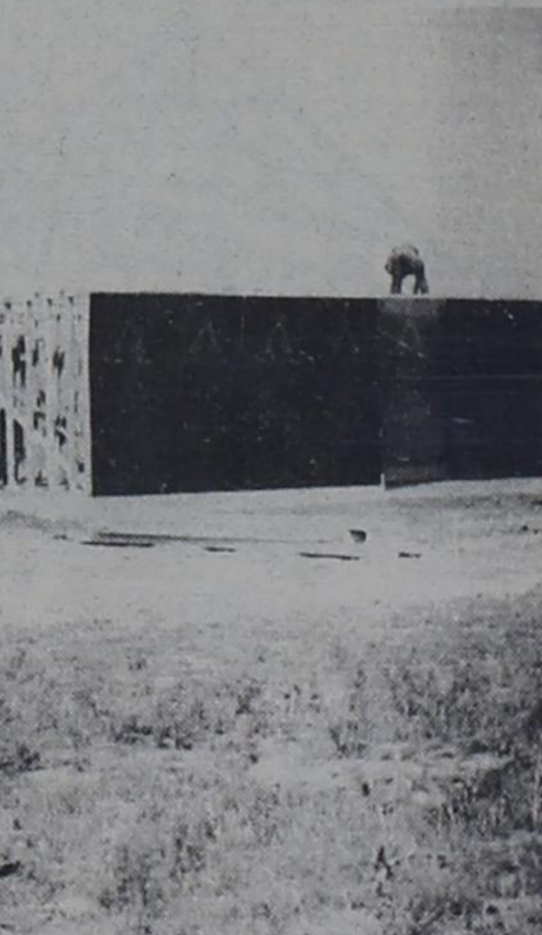

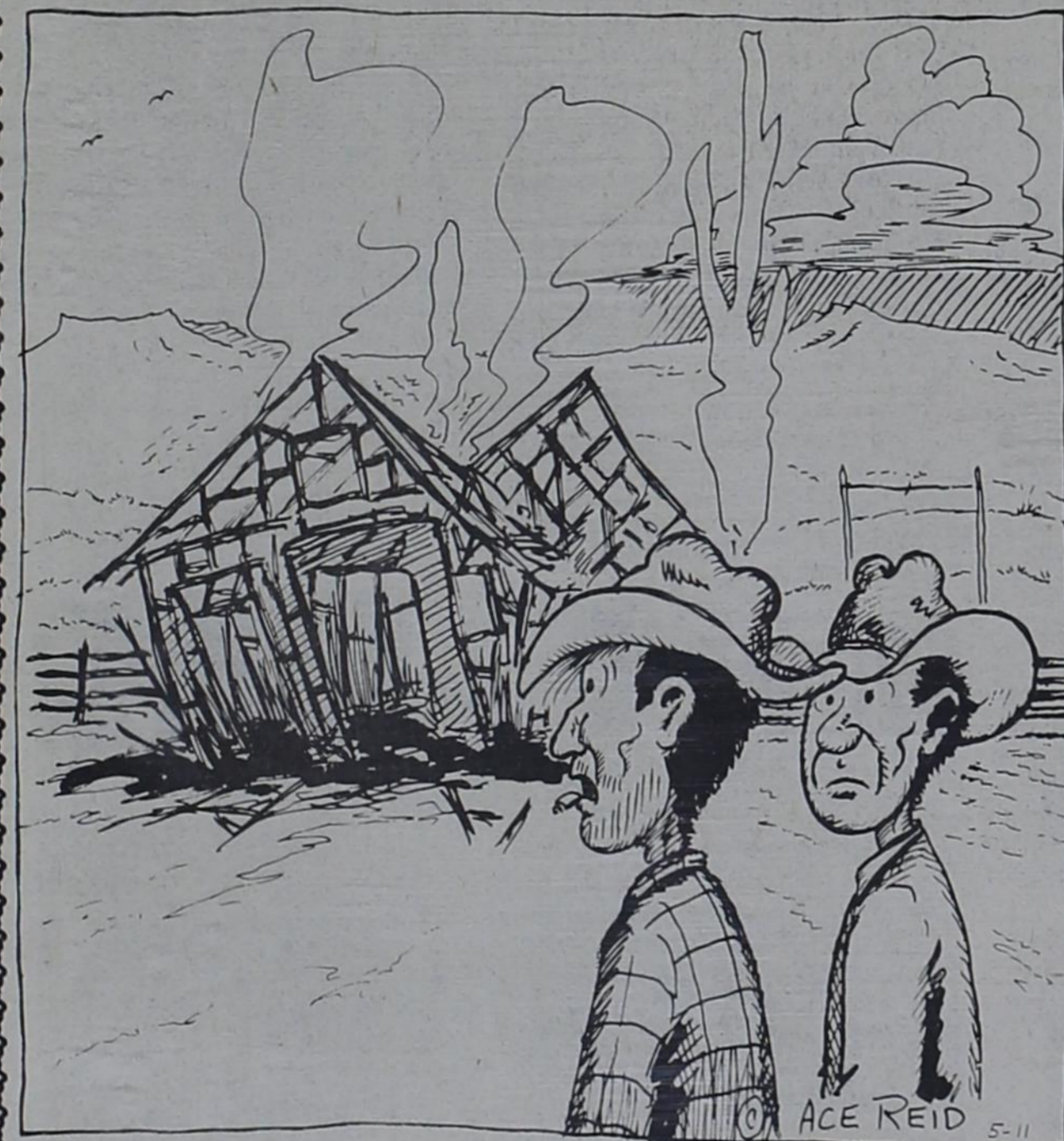

Rules Of Life

I have in my library a book of sermons written by T.B. Larimore who lived in the late eighteen hundreds. He said "These are the rules that I have tried to follow and will continue to try and follow, both in letter and in spirit, till God shall call me home: (1) Be kind; (2) be meek; (3) be true; (4) be humble; (5) be gentle; (6) be polite; (7) be patient; (8) be earnest; (9) be careful; (10) be hopeful; (11) be faithful; (12) be cheerful; (13) be grateful; (14) be generous; (15) be prayerful; (16) be courteous; (17) be unselfish; (18) be thoughtful; (19) be industrious; (20) always do the right; (21) be conscientious; (22) do as much good as possible; (23) do as little evil as possible; (24) eat to live, not live to eat; (25) if possible, be perfectly pure; (26) if not be pure as possible; (27) always make the best of the situation; (28) be clean-body, soul, and spirit-clean in thought, in word, in deed-always clean; (29) conscientiously consecrate all to Christ-head, hand, heart-body, soul, spirit-time, tongue, talent-mind, muscle, money-consecrate all to Him who gave his very life to ransom a recreant, lost and ruined race."

These rules would be a challenge to anyone in the twentieth century and would be worthy of our efforts to make them ours. Please turn now in your Bibles to Phillipians the fourth chapter and read verse eight.

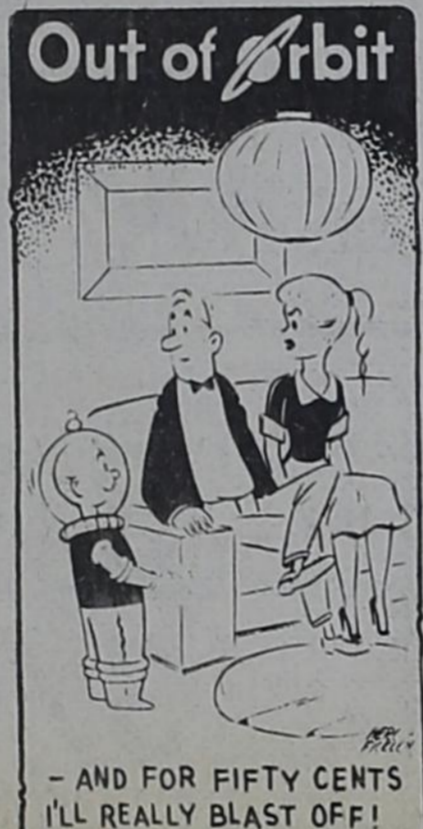

The director's award for the Outstanding Junior High Band student was presented to Stacey Whitecotton, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Billy Whitecotton.

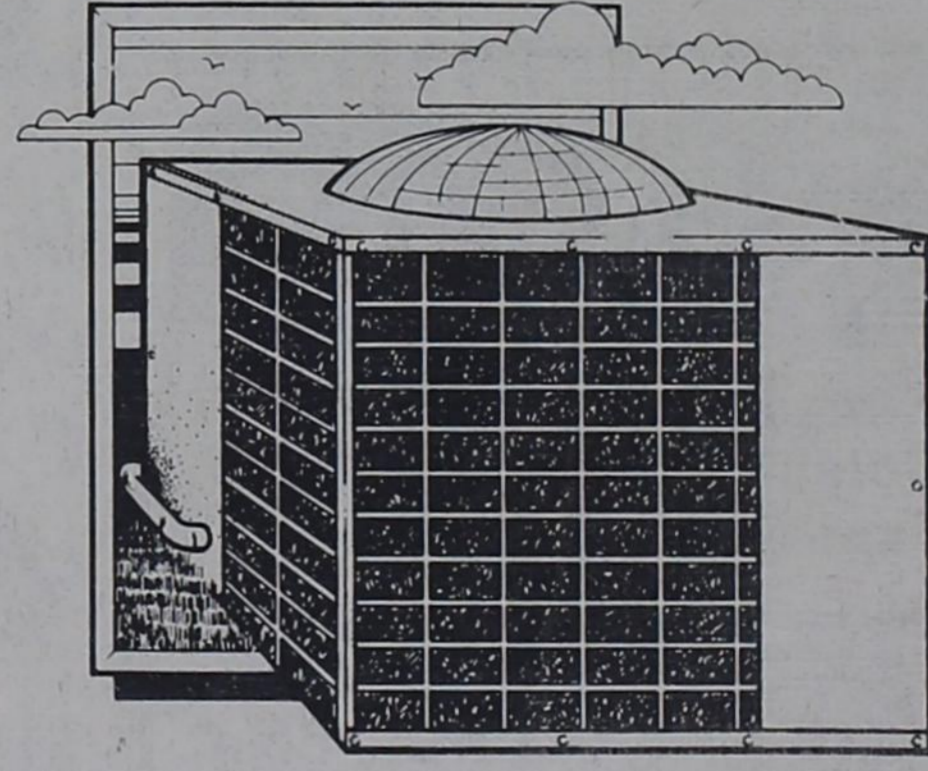
