In the death of Senato
Hanna the republican party
has lost its most potentia
character and the country ha
lost an interesting figure in ublic affairs.
Mr. Hanna furst came into notice in 1895 as the manager of Major McKinley's presi. dential campaign. A successful iron manufacturer in Ohio, he was not previously known in politics beyond his imme diate section. For many years he had enjoyed an intımate personal acquajntance with McKinley, and upon his nomination became chairman of the republican National exe-
tive committee.
Instantly he became the central figure and the most powerful factor in the republican organization. His methods were "strictly business." He collected the greatest campaign fund ever raised in to the best advantage.
It is related that Major McKinley in the outset. remarked to Mr. Hanna, "Mark, please to Mr. Hanna, Mark, please remember that there are some
things I would not do to be president of the United States," which .vas a protest better nature revolted and a plea not to have his office compromısed by campaign promises which he could not
fulfill in good conscience. Within the "practical" limitations of the commercial conscience this request was doubt
less respected to the extent that the new president was placed under no offensive obligatıons and no post-campaign influence by his adroit mana-

Indeed, the sentiment Mr. Hanna felt for Major
McKinley was so affectionate Mckinley was so affectionate
that he sought to save his friend trom all possible em-
barrassment, and he graciously refrained from attempting to exercise the control "of the party boss. With commenda-
