The Lufkin National bank brought suit against the Merchants and Farmer's Cotton Oil Company to recover \$5,000, evidenced by a promissory note purporting to have been executed in behalf of the oil company by its general manager and attested by the secretary under the corporate ANOTHER crank was arrested seal. It was shown on the for trying to gain entrance at trial that B. S. Wettermark, and wanted an interview with the general manager, W. B. the presidedt with the purpose Pearson, to the note without secretary, concealing from the secretary that the signature of He had a loaded revolver and the manager was not genuine. a box of cartridges, just as all Pearson's power to execute the note was shown. Wettermark sold this note to the Lufkin National Bank for value and appropriated the proceeds to his own use.

The bank bought the note without notice of the forgery. The oil company pleaded non est factum. Judgment in the court below was in favor of plaintiff. The court of civil appeals held that the act secretary in attesting the note and affixing the seal of the company was a representation act of the company and that as his act in thus attesting the note was within the apparent scope of his power as agent of the company, the latter was stopped to question the genuineness of the paper to the detriment of an innocent holder.


