Story of How a Western County Got Its Court House.

Marfa, Texas, May 30. Dear Sentinel:

In a former letter I mention-NACOGDOCHES county needs ed the court house of this-Presidio-county, estimating its cost at not less than \$35. 000. I have since learned that tne court house and jail cost \$125,000; and hereby hangs a bit of interesting history.

A good many years ago, before this court house was built Presidio county included the territory now comprising Jeff Davis and Brewster counties, when a bond issue was voted jail to be erected at the county site. At that time the county site was at Fort Davis, 22 miles from Marfa, and off the railroad. I beg to call your attention to an excerpt of an opinion rendered, at my request, by the attorney general of the State, which is self explanatory, as follows:

"The Twenty-ninth legislature did not, so far as I can learn, pass any law to extend the benefits of the act of May 12, 1899, to indigent widows of Confederate soldiers or sailors who were married after March 1, 1866, and prior to March 1, 1880. The constitutional amendment is not self-executing. It merely attthorizes the legislature to give such aid, and, therefore, I advise you that your department has no authority under existing law to grant pensions to such widows who were marthough prior to March 1,
