### ONE PRISONER ESCAPED.

Virgil Acrey Who Was Arrested on a Charge of Felony Escaped.

Deputy Sheriff Beatty of Caddo county, arrived in Nacogdoches yesterday afternoon for the prisoners who were arrested Sunday by Sheriff Beckner and Constable Will McMillan, but when he went to the sheriff's office for the men they were not in jail. Two of the men, Douglas Hall and George McCann were found in the streets, but Virgil Acrey could not be found in the city. Notwithstanding the fact that they had been duly arrested and should have been locked up in the county jail, the crime for which they were indicted by the grand jury of Panola county was a felony, the charge alleging that they had committed burglary with the use of fire arms.

Deputy Sheriff Beatty said that he would take the two men that were found here, but that it was Acrey that he wanted and wanted him bad. That Acrey was the star actor in the crime for which all three had been indicted.

### SERIOUS CHARGE

Tobe Buckley in Jail Here.

Tobe Buckley, a very black negro, was brought here on Monday by Deputy Sheriff Beckner. Buckley was charged with the burglary of Mrs. Henry Hays, near here, through the window of her house. It is understood that the matter will be heard in court next week, the grand jury of this county in the district having the right to indict for this particular offense. The court officially has understood from yesterday that the sheriff of Sabine was dispatching the negro here with all haste for safe keeping and for trial.

Process was issued this afternoon to Sabine county for the witnesses and grand jury in the hands of Deputy Sheriff Young. It is expected that they will arrive early Monday at Nacogdoches.

Much excitement at Hamblin, Caddo county, was known yesterday after the arrival of a party of negroes, who were in the hands of Sheriff George Adams, of Caddo county. 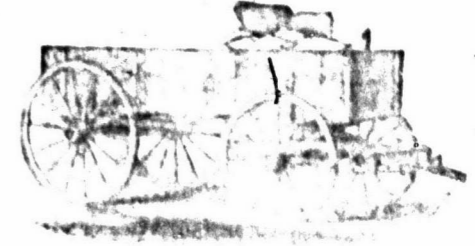

The farmers' organization and the merchants of East Texas should work in harmony with each other.

The Palestine Herald has the thanks of The Sentinel for a picture of the "next governor of Texas," Hon. Tom Campbell of Palestine.

EVERY bank in the cotton growing states will advance a reasonable amount of money on the cotton crop this year, but do not expect the banks to carry the paper over thirty or sixty days.

THE SENTINEL wants all the news of the county, but once and for all times, correspondents are notified that sensational stuff will not be used. Bear this in mind in the future when writing your letters.

THE present price of cotton is not in keeping with the actual amount that will be harvested this year, and those who are in a position to hold their surplus will no doubt realize better prices a little later on.

FARMERS who are indebted to the merchant of Nacogdoches will find the merchants willing to hold their customers cotton until the market reaches 11 cents. That is provided the bottom does not drop out of the market entirely.

FARMERS are invited to send The Sentinel the number of acres they will plant in tobacco next year, provided a government expert is stationed here. Don't put the matter off from time to time, but do it now. The Sentinel wants to send the report to the superintendent of the tobacco experimental station as soon as possible.

SEVERAL counties in the state are making preparations to hold good roads conventions. Nacogdoches county should get busy and keep up with the procession. Judge Berger can use the columns of the Sentinel and other county papers for the purpose of advertising a meeting of the people to take up the subject of good roads.

WHILE indications are that the cotton crop in the south this year will be the shortest in the history of the cotton industry yet the farmers should watch the market closely and when it does get to a point where cotton can be produced at a profit they should sell, and not wait until the price reaches some point above 12 cents.

GRAND old Texas, one of the most favored southern states has to have her warrants sent to the money changers shop where a mighty shaving takes place. This shows that there is something radically wrong in the administration of the affairs of the state. Instead of there being a deficit, there should be several millions to the good in the strong box.

### WHAT'S THE USE.

A number of The Sentinel's farmer friends have mentioned the fact that they would like to take stock in a cotton mill to be located in Nacogdoches, they believing that it would be a good thing for the farmers of Nacogdoches county. The Sentinel is satisfied that a mill would be a good thing, and that it would be instrumental in a large measure for better prices for the staple, but there is one that presents itself along this line that does not look well for an institution of this kind. It is this. There is an enterprise already established that every farmer in the county should have a kindly feeling for and that is the cotton oil mill of this city. Before the erection of the mill the price of seed was a mere trifle and many tons of seed was allowed to rot at the gigs throughout the county, as soon as the trusts found that they had competition in the field they used their every effort to throttle the enterprise and advanced the price of seed. Patriotic citizens of Nacogdoches met and they put up enough of the long green to burn a wet dog and the mill pulled through the first part of the season and the trust put the price of seed at a price that was reasonable when they found that the Nacogdoches concern had plenty of money. Then their next step was to cause a slump in the price of oil, hoping by this method that the small mills throughout the country would have to be closed, and right there they succeeded in many instances, in fact there are numbers and numbers of small mills that have been sold this year under the sheriff's hammer on account of the fact that the mills could not dispose of their products at prices sufficient to meet the running expenses of the mill. Then the main feature of this kind of business that does not look well is the fact that the farmers will persist in selling their seed to the trust when they have a mill at their own door that will use all the seed in this county. If the farmers would rather sell their stuff to trusts and combinations when the home concerns are paying the same price, what's the use in the papers over the country whooping up enterprises for the benefit of the country and then the farmers come along and knock the good that has been done? The Sentinel is not an organ of the farmers union, but respectfully refers the case of the cotton oil mill and the outside mills for their consideration. If The Sentinel understands the objects of the Farmers Union it was organized to better the condition of the farming interests and the farmers especially, and any institution that will furnish them a market for their product should be patronized by them, provided that the same price prevailed, this being the facts in the case the home mill should be given the preference when marketing seed. If the Union believes in selling seed to the trusts and combinations they have missed the objects originally promulgated by the founder of the Union. Until

the farmers make a change of front in the way of supporting home institutions and factories, the idea of trying to get other enterprises here is out of the question. In other words, "what's the use?"

### NACOGDOCHES ROADS.

To the stranger traveling through this county in a buggy he would come to the conclusion that the county was on the verge of bankruptcy, to judge from the roads and the bridges over which he would necessarily have to travel. It is claimed by those who are in a position to know say that this county has the poorest roads and bridges of any county in Eastern Texas, and that some of the bridges would not be safe for a goat to cross. Fact of the matter is this county is rich enough to have good roads and bridges, and the country people should see that they are provided with these necessities. They are entitled to them and they are the ones who should take the initiatory steps towards improvements along these lines. There should be at least one first-class road through each commissioner's beat leading to the county site, and it should be graded and cared for. In the northern states the citizens in the country precincts take special pride in their roads, and each community tries to have just a little better roads than their neighbors. This would be a good example for the farmers of Nacogdoches to follow.

THE doings of the last legislature has convinced The Sentinel that too much care can not be exercised by the people of the state in the selection of their representatives in the legislature. It is rather early to take up this matter, but it is a question of so much importance, that it should be talked over in advance of the scramble for office that will take place a few months hence. Good business men should be chosen for these places—men who are conversant with the little inns and outs of a successful business career. True it will be a sacrifice to them, but the material well fare of the state demands such a sacrifice, and they are themselves interested in the affairs of the state to such an extent that it is almost becomes their bounden duty to take some action in the matter. The last legislature can really be considered a joke, there were some good men in both branches, but the poor fellows were in the hopeless minority and they could not run the whole works by themselves.

ANSWERS to The Sentinel's request for a report on the tobacco acreage for the next year are coming in and in a few weeks the list will be printed. All who contemplate trying a few acres next year will help the cause along if they will let The Sentinel have their figures.

GOOD roads and a few good bridges are things that the farmers of this county are entitled to, and they should see that the county commissioners provide them.

### SHOULD BE NO FRICTION.

There are many country people under the impression that factories and enterprises organized by the town people is detrimental to the interests of the country folks. That is to say they are of the opinion that when the merchants and the capitalists of the towns combine their wealth it is done with the main object of beating the farmers out of their products. They talk this kind of stuff so much that they finally believe that it is a fact. There should be no friction between the farmers and the local enterprises that consume farm products. On the other hand they should foster such enterprises and give to the same their loyal support. The more factories located in a town, and the more people induced to live in the cities and the town means just that much better market for the products of the farm, it matters not what that product may be. For the farmers wife the factories and the enterprises that employ men to run the affairs of the same means a better market for chickens, butter and eggs. The people in towns are dependent upon the products of the farm and they usually pay the best prices for these things. Then again the factories creates a market for the corn crop, the cotton crop, and a market for the live stock. In view of these facts is it not the duty of the farmers of the south to stand by their local factories? Is it not their duty to see that so far as in their power lies, that they will render local enterprises an opportunity to do business and compete with the trusts and combinations, and until all come to a better understanding and work in unison for the manufacturing and industrial welfare of the south, this section of the United States will continue in the old rut of having to pay the freight on the raw product to the factories in the east, pay the freight on the finished product back to the south and then pay the profits that each man must have who has handled the raw product from the time it left the farm until it was purchased from the merchant in the finished product. Think these matters over and then resolve that so long as the local factories and mills will buy your raw goods that you will not sell to the trusts and combinations.

IN a few years the Elberta peach crop in this part of the state will be a very cheap article, and in view of this fact it would not be a very bad idea for the farmers and the truckers to begin now on a plan for the establishment of suitable canneries in this part of the fruit growing belt, where the surplus crop could be disposed of at prices that will pay the trucker far better than having to ship fruit to market and then only realize enough out of the shipment to pay for crates. The canning factory is the only salvation for the fruit farmer and the truck grower.

BETTER roads in this county would be a good thing for country people who make this town their market.

THE meeting of the truck growers should be attended Saturday afternoon. It is at this meeting that the officers are to be selected for the next year, and other matters of importance will come up that should interest every member of the organization.

DURING the three "Karnivals of Kommerce" Nacogdoches cared for and entertained thousands of strangers, and the town was talked about for many days afterwards. The Business League desire to make the trade and sale days this month better events than the "Karnival of Kommerce."

HON. T. M. CAMPBELL.

Some days ago an invitation, numerous signed by prominent citizens of Nacogdoches was sent to Hon. T. M. Campbell, of Palestine, to deliver an address to the voters of this county at an early date and the distinguished gentleman has responded accepting the invitation, and it is understood will be here on Monday, the 9th, to make an address.

Col. Campbell is a democratic candidate for Governor, and is an able and pleasing speaker and will no doubt have a large audience. He is at this time the unquestioned choice of a large majority of the voters of this section, and his visit here will doubtless add much strength to his candidacy.

WITH the memory of hanging and burning as a penalty for criminal assault still fresh in the minds of the negroes of the south yet there are some of the lower class of negroes who pay no attention to the awful fate that will surely overtake them, and continue in the certain path to predilection. While the mob is chasing a negro for this crime in Jackson county, one of the devils in human form enters the home of a farmer near Hemphill and commits a similar crime. The officers must do their duty to save their prisoners, and this devil is brought to Nacogdoches for safe keeping. The officers here will endeavor to do their duty in the premises, but the idea of putting a man in the old bat roost that is called a jail in this county from the attack of a mob sounds more like a joke than anything else.

THERE has been a few people from the north who have come here with the expectation of finding the same conditions existing here as in the section of the country they left. One man brought an ice cutting outfit expecting to cut ice from some of the East Texas streams and storing it away for summer. That poor fellow after staying here a short while, decided that he would have to go back north and he went. When you write your friends tell them of the difference in this country and that in which they live.

THERE will be something doing here on trade and sales days, October 23 and 24.

### Committee Meeting.

At a meeting of the Business League last Monday evening the matter of having a sales or trades day in Nacogdoches in the near future was discussed and a committee appointed to draft plans, formulate a program, and set the matter on foot.

This committee met last Friday afternoon and decided upon the following.

The dates for the trades day were placed at Oct. 23 and 24.

The event will be thoroughly advertised in all the papers published in counties adjoining Nacogdoches. The home papers will also advertise and push the affair. Thousands of circulars will be distributed in Nacogdoches and surrounding counties.

The object of the event will be to attract the people to Nacogdoches and afford them an opportunity to meet and mingle, traffic and trade with each other.

These trades and sales days have been very successful in all other towns that have tried them and the beneficial results have been felt and appreciated both by the people from outside the towns and the merchants and business men in the towns.

The following is an outline of the program contemplated by the committee:

Grand parade headed by the "Boll-Weevil Band." This band will also furnish music at intervals throughout both days and nights of the event.

All merchants and business men will be asked to decorate their places of business in order to give the town an appearance of gayety, though this matter is to be left strictly to the direction of the business men.

Barrels of water will be placed at convenient points over the town, so that no one will need go thirsty.

An open air concert or free for all show of some kind will be given at night for the entertainment of the people.

An Old Fiddlers' Contest, free for all, will be another most interesting and enjoyable feature of the entertainment.

Sack Races will be a feature of the event. All who have seen these know how laughable and enjoyable they are, and those who have not can imagine the fun a lot of young men would create trying to race for a prize while tied up in sacks.

Another most novel part of the program will be a "Potato Race." This is one of those things that cannot be described, but when once seen will never be forgotten. It is very exciting and always causes much enthusiasm.

There will be Foot Races. One for boys between the ages of 10 and 15; one for men between the ages of 18 and 25; and one for old men above 50.

The great feature of the contests, the most exciting, interesting and novel number on the two days program will be a "Farmers Harnessing and Wagon Race." This contest or race is conducted about in the following manner: The contestants, who

are farmers that have come into town with their wagons, are camped in some convenient and suitable spot; their horses are tethered at the rear end of the wagons quietly feeding; the contestants are seated around their camp fires eating supper; at a given signal they spring to their feet, hasten to their horses, harness and hitch them to the wagon, the one driving to and crossing a given line first wins the prize. People who have witnessed these contests say there is nothing more exciting.

Among the prizes that will be awarded are the following: One for the finest hog brought to town and sold on either of the two days.

One for the finest dozen chickens marketed during the event.

One for the farmer hauling the largest number of ladies to town in his wagon on either day—distance traveled not to be less than five miles.

One for the finest pair of mules exhibited in town on either day.

One for the farmer who hauls a bale of cotton the longest distance to be marketed here on either day.

One for the farmer who hauls a load of cotton seed not weighing under 1000 pounds the longest distance to the Nacogdoches Oil Mill.

The prizes will consist both of purses and articles of merchandise from the Nacogdoches merchants.

Arrangements will be made to enable all who come here desiring to do so to trade and traffic in anything they want to bring to the sale.

Special rates will be secured on all railroads.
