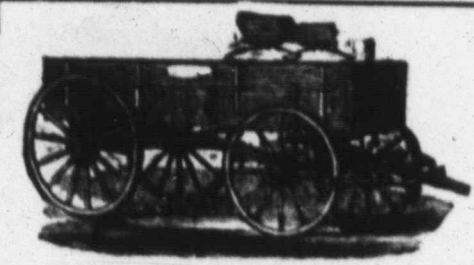
Finance Committee Reports.

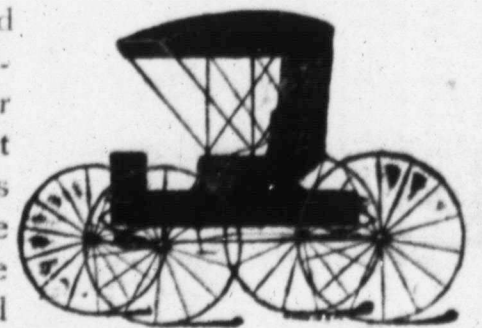

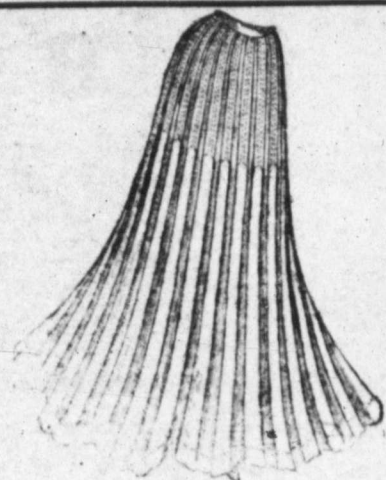
