Special Term of District Court

A special term of the district court of Nacogdoches county will be held beginning on Monday, December 11, and at this term all the cases in which the judge is disqualified to sit on the bench will be heard.

In the matter of a judge for a special term there has been no selection, but the bar will find some good judge to occupy the bench while vacated by judge Peakins.

A New Trial Granted

This morning the motion for a new trial in the Bob Curl case was taken up by the court, and the new trial was granted.

Bob Curl was brought into the court room and the judge informed the defendant of the decree, and stated that he was released from jail until the next regular term of the court, and at that time he would have to appear for trial on the charge of manslaughter.

New Bridges Here.

The new bridges which were recently purchased by the city council are here and the work of erecting them has been begun. Mr. Ben F. Cox of the Leversedge Bridge Co. of Fort Worth is in the city superintending the work.

The big bridge on Pillar street is the first one to be built. It will be 88 feet long and will have a steel span of 60 feet and will be 20 feet wide. In addition to this there will be a foot bridge 6 feet wide built in connection to the wagon bridge.

The Main street bridge will be the next one to be put up and then Fredonia.

Mr. Cox says he that will have the bridges ready to turn over to the council within three weeks.

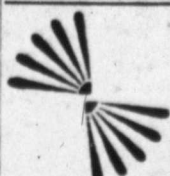

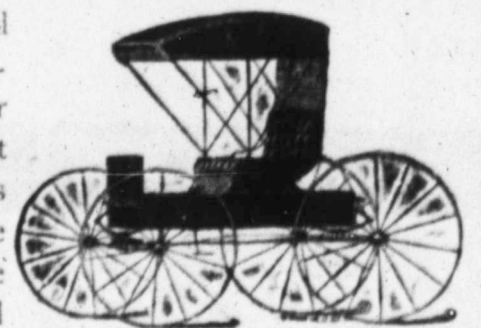

NACOGDOCHES COUNTY should have a new court house and jail.

THE truck and fruit shippers should use Texas crates and boxes.

BETTER roads and bridges or this county should be the motto of the commissioners court.

THE happiest man on earth is the man who can manage his affairs so that he can live within his income.

MEN of sterling worth and fixed integrity are the ones whom the counties should send to the legislature.

THE cigar smokers of this section of the state should call for the Nacogdoches brands. The smokers of Texas should all smoke Texas cigars.

PRESENT indications are that the life insurance agent in Texas will have a hard proposition talking life insurance in the near future.

BETTER roads are recommended by the grand jury, the justices of the various precincts are reminded of their duties in looking after the road overseers.

SEVERAL hundred southern farmers will find the best locations in Nacogdoches county for homes. Good schools and churches and good society.

POLITICS in the next campaign promises to be fast and furious. The pot has begun to simmer, and with the coming of spring the political cauldron will be boiling over.

IN looking over the market for anything see that the article you are looking for is made at home. Stand by the home institutions for only by so doing will they ever become a success.

IN his speech the other day Mr. Campbell said that in local option districts the law should be enforced and if there was anything wrong with the law it should be corrected.

ALL the office furniture, and the store fixtures used in this part of East Texas should be made in Nacogdoches. The factories are located here and the people who have these things made should consult the Nacogdoches market.

THE grand jury has recommended that Nacogdoches should have a new jail for the safe keeping of her criminals and also those who are confined in the county jail on criminal charges. They also state that the building now used as a jail is wholly unfit to put men in.

THE department of agriculture will station an expert here another year to help the farmers in raising tobacco. Every farmer who contemplates raising tobacco will be doing the cause a good turn by sending The Sentinel the number of acres they propose to cultivate next year.

AS TO THE NEGRO.

IT is now high time that the prominent negroes of the nation should look into matters of vital importance to their race. There are ideas in the minds of some of the lower class of negroes, which if not checked, will eventually lead to trouble, and trouble which will almost lead to an annihilation of that race of people. The vicious element of the negro race must be taught that he must keep his hands off of the fair women of this land; he must be taught that the women are queens and that to think or speak of them other than with reverence will mean swift punishment. And not only should this be applicable to the negro but to some few white men. Something will have to be done and that soon. Such crimes as that committed in the little town of Edna are sorely trying to men's souls and it would not require many more such occurrences to cause the men of Texas and the nation to raise up in arms and begin to clean out the community in which the crime was committed. In Ellis county where an outrage had been committed the negroes were told to move and they did not tarry on the order of going, and in all probability they will be so informed in the vicinity of Edna. In the event they refuse to obey the command it is only reasonable to suppose that serious trouble will result. There is only one solution to the negro problem in some localities and that is for the leading negroes to take the matter up and begin to educate their race and point out the right way for them to become citizens of this country, and that is to attend strictly to their own business; go to work and make an honest living, and for the safety of their own race let the white women of the south alone.

GRAIN and oil were the articles of food commerce in the days of the Pharaohs. They are to-day, except instead of the corn carried by the brethren of Joseph, we have wheat and instead of the olive oil, a jar for which forty thieves in the Arabian Night were hid, we have the oil of the famous big little seed.

A NUMBER of the exchanges received at this table are beginning to talk about the trade and sales days which will be held in this city on the 23 and 24. They all predict that it will be one of the biggest events ever pulled off in this section and are advising the merchants in their respective towns to watch the results, and follow the example of the enterprising merchants of Nacogdoches.

THE grand jury's report of the finance committee states "there is nothing in said report that points to any criminal violation of the law by any of the officers of the county," and yet before the committee made its report to the grand jury there were divers and sundry reports in circulation alleging that there was anywhere from one thousand to a half million dollars short in

some of the accounts of the officers. The report of the committee has been filed with the district clerk and is now a part of the court records.

THE Beaumont Enterprise believes that eunuchs should be made of such characters as Monk Gibson. This would indeed be drifting back to the dark days of rude and barbaric torture, but if a few were made eunuch and turned loose it might have a good effect upon others inclined to do such hellish deeds.

THE tobacco growers are not sending in their names as fast as The Sentinel would like to see them. This is a very important matter and the farmers should interest themselves in this crop. It does not cost much to make the experiment, and the chances are that some money will be made. If an expert is placed in charge of the crop a market will be guaranteed.

THE department of agriculture has just issued Bulletin No. 22 of the biological survey, in which all the birds known to eat the boll weevil are named. The quail, dove, and the plover are mentioned as being the enemy of the boll weevil, and recommends that they should be protected. Those who are interested in the matter should send to the department for one of these bulletins.

THE farmers of East Texas do not take enough interest in the matter of diversification. They should all attend the meetings of the fruit and truck growers associations and learn what other localities are doing in the way of making a living without having to depend solely upon the cotton crop for what money they have. The newspapers of this state have been trying to get them interested for the past several years, but they seem to take their own sweet time.

NOW that there has been several good frosts over the south the quarantines should be raised. Nacogdoches would like to see it raised and the night trains put on again. Business here has been cut off and the traveling public has been to a great expense on account of the fact that there has been but one train a day in this part of the state on account of the fact that the yellow fever quarantine caused the suspension of the night service on the roads entering this city.

THE officers of the old line life insurance companies should receive the same treatment at the hands of justice as was dealt out to Mrs. Chadwick. In fact they deserve a little more justice meted out. Mrs. Chadwick had no control of the funds which she squandered and she went to the banks in a business like way and just simply out talked the presidents of the financial institutions and they loaned her the money, while McCull and his crowd of grafters were stealing the money that belonged to the policy holders.

"THE JURY DEN."

Nacogdoches county should have a new court house. The present building is too small, and is wholly unfit to be used for court purposes. Recently a judge while sitting on this bench made the remark to the sheriff as he started to the jury room with a jury: "Mr. Sheriff, see if you can find a more comfortable place for the jury. That den where they are required to stay is not fit for a well man, much less for a man who is feeling badly, as I understand that some of the jurors are." It's a fact, and the judge named the little den that the jurors are required to deliberate in rightly, it is nothing more than a den. The Sentinel will venture the assertion that there is not a free "nigger" in the county but what has a larger place to keep his razor back hogs in, than the place where white men are required to deal out justice to all who are tried before the courts of this county. If Nacogdoches had a civic club which would embrace all the ladies of the county as members, and they would hold one of their conventions in the old bat roost on the south side of the square called a court house that they would go home and give their husbands instructions not to attend court as jurors until a suitable place was secured by the county to hold court. To spend a week in that old hole is enough to drive a man "lug house." The commissioners court and the people of the county are interested in this matter and they should get together on the question of building a new court house for the county and also a jail. Both are needed and that badly.

THE Farmers Union and kindred farmers organizations should encourage the membership to invest in better stock for the farm. A few fine hogs would be a good start—talk it up in the meetings and cut out the mortgage system and cotton. To make money out of the cotton crop, it should be grown the same as truck patches are now grown. Raise all the corn and meat to be used on the farm and make a little extra to sell. Make the cotton crop the side issue.

THERE is one thing the people in the smaller towns are painfully short in, and that is enthusiasm. They seem to be contented with letting well enough alone, and take no interest in the betterment of their respective towns. If the fact is mentioned that the foundation should be laid for future generations to build to they will invariably say that the future generations should look after these things when the time arrives for them to take charge of the affairs of this country. This is a sad state of affairs to hold up before the people, but it is nevertheless the truth. In some instances the men who make these remarks have sons who will some day have to take up the burden where "the old man" left it, and they will find the cares of life rather burdensome if no foundation has been laid upon which to build cities and towns.

CHANGE OF VENUE ENTERED.

So Far as This County is Concerned Case is Matter of History.

So far as the courts of this county are concerned the case of the State of Texas, vs. Dr. A. M. Denman will enter into the court history of this county as one of those cases where a lot of expense has been stacked up, and the case has not been brought to trial. Not that the defendant was not ready for trial—he was here yesterday and also a week ago ready and anxious for trial, but it was the state that was short of witnesses. This, however, was no fault of the state, for the sheriff had all the papers in the case served, yet the hand of providence caused one of the principal witnesses to become sick, and the attending physician sent his affidavit to the court stating that Mrs. Barrett under no circumstances could attend this meeting of the court.

Yesterday morning it was understood that the case would be taken to Rusk on a change of venue, but the judge decided to get it out of this district and sent the matter to Polk county.

Both the prosecution and the defense have spent many dollars in attending court, and yet the whole matter will have to be thrashed over again.

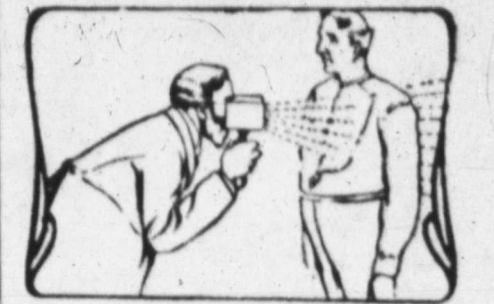

To Hon. J. I. Perkins, Judge of the District Court of Nacogdoches, county:

We, the grand jury for the September term, 1905, of said court, beg leave to report as follows:

We have been in session at this term eleven days and during that time have investigated and returned indictments in sixty-six criminal cases. We have investigated the present condition of the county jail, and we find the same to be a very unsafe institution for the safe keeping of prisoners. In our judgment the county is in need of a new and safer, as well as a more decent place for the safe keeping of her criminals, or persons confined on criminal charges. We find the jail fairly well kept and reasonably clean for a building in its condition.

We find the roads of the county in fairly good condition for this season of the year, but have not investigated any particular road at this time for the reason that the term for the working of the roads for the present year has not yet expired. In this connection we beg to suggest that the various justices of the peace, be diligent in looking after the discharge of their duties on the part of road overseers in their several precincts.
