Department of Agriculcure due to the fact that the department's estimate of 10 ,167,818 bales was based on 500 pound par bale gross, have been deducted for ging and ties, $m$ iking the bale $7^{8}$ pounds net. Said Mr Hayne: "It this year's esti mate had been made on the same basis as last year's estimate, the figutes that would have been read out on the Cotton Exchange today would have been $9,730,434$ bales, in stead of $10,167,818$ bales and it seems most extraordinary that the Department of Agri culture in spite of the protest of the New Orleans Cotton Exchange should have thus willtully created a wrong impression in the pdblic ruind by making the estimate on an entirely different basis from what they had hitherto done. The spinners' takings last year were 12,459 ,000 bales. So ar this year they are 184,000 bales more than to the same date last year, which shows that it the supply were there the spinners' takings for two years would certainly be 25 , owever, is iess tnan supply ooo bales, it is simply an impossible proposition for the supply to meet the demand There is but one answer and hat is, cotton must advance to a price that will check con sumption. The mills have already bought fully 60 per cent of this crop at an average their purchases to this date ast year. therefore with far better trade and materially higher prices for goods they can afford to pay very much more than todays prices be tore consumption will be
