Brooks is chairman of the county democratic executive committee of Panola county and refused to place the names of the appellees on the officia ballot, under the attorney's ruling. The appellees sued out a writ of mandamus in the district court of that county and it was granted, and the decision of the supreme court today sustains that mandamus. Over 50 counties in the state are affected by this hold ing of the supreme court
