Every bank failure is in variably followed by sugge tions as to other methods of keeping the savings of small
depositors, but none seem to offer such but none seem to frer such absolute se
There really is no excuse for the failure of any bank moderate degree of care and honesty, but there will always be unfaithtul presidents, cashrers, tellers and other officials and employes, and losses are
so whatever promises satety to small deositors is worthy ot attention. Many peodele of small who earn small wages, en deavor to save by depositin ew dollars, and often smallsums, and every failure of discourages such depositors and does incalculable injury honest, safe banks.
Every such failure will Etrengthen the sentimeht in avor of postal savings banks, which have proved very popular in England and have greatly encouraged saving by The people of moderate means that 32,000 depositors are in danger of losing their savings by the Chicago bank łailure, and doubtless the most of
them would be very ready w to deposit their savings gs bank.
There are in such banks England $\$ 760,000,000$, they are steadily intreasing. It is perferable, of course, as ness of the country to have all the banking business done by private enterprise, but there has always been and will al ways be many people who will whom would trust the govern whom
ment.

It is better for such people o use the postal savings bank than to use no place of deposit but bury and hide their avings, as many do.
