Recommendations Adopted by the Iexas Good Roads Associatian. At the recent annual thee ng of the Texas Good Road association held at Waco, the
ollowing recommendations vere unanimously adopted: First-That the Texa State Good Roids Associaton, through it - ! resid $\mathbf{n}$, appoint five inembers to present in person to his excellency, Governor Tom Campbell, also o the h horable members he Thrieth Lezislature, or ieth Lexislature the Thiror that purpose, and urge recommendation and passage of suitable laws to enforce th ction of this body.
Second-That there be
Highway Commissioner, wh shall be a pracical road build er and clvil engineer, compeent to advise as to manne and matertal for building roads; his duties to be defined by egislative action
Third-That the Legisla ture repeal the law, abolish ing the five days labor as now required, substituting theretor road tax to be paid in cash, Fourth-We recommend the repeal of the convict con-
tract system, and that all available convicts and jail pris oners be compelled to prepare material for roads or work in urther that the system of em ploying ennvicts in the mechanical and other industria departments of the State be discontinued, where they come contact and in competition
Fith-That suitable laws e passed carrying out the provisions of the Constitution, giving precincts or special po litical divisionss of any county the right to issue bonds for the permanent improvemen of the public roads in that parlaws be known as the "Loca Uption Good Roads Law.'

PROFSSOR GREER KIILLED. Meets Death in a Runaway A Accident Ihe following from the Wa-
co Times-Herald vill be read

ches. Prot. I. F. Greer, who

ent of the Nacogidoches pub-
lic school, was admired and
beloved by all who knew him
here, and his sudden and
tragic death has cast a gloom
over this city as dark and in-
effaceable as if it had occurred
in our midst. Here is tie sad
sory as told by the Times-
Herald:
"One of the most distress ing accidents which has hap
pened in Waco in pened in Waco in a tong
while happened late yesterday afternoon, in which Professo J. F. Greer, principal of San ger Avenue public school, was killed; and his daughter,
Miss Lillian, who was in the buggy with him, was painfut ly though not dangerousl bruised.

South Waco fire station, and near to the residence of Alder man Garrett, the horse be gan running, being eager to get home. Professor Greer curned the horse, on a cross other side of the fire station and the animal went running at a rapid gait towards Sev at a rapid gait towards Sev-
enth street. Professor Greer held firmly to the lines, quidabout the time the vehicle eached Seventh street, when he met a buggy.. In trying buggy and to make the turn into Seventh street necessi tated a double turn, and Proessor Greer did his best to
make it, but this was impos make it, but this was imposacute, and the buggy was overturned, throwing both o Protessor Greer the ground. Prolessor Greer struck on his head and was rendered un conscious.
