A majority of the senat investigating committee offered a resolution asking the senate for authority to send a subcommittee to examine the books of the Waters Pierce Oil Company and secure the testimony of $\mathrm{H} . \mathrm{C}$ Pierce before closing the so called investigation of Bailey This was met with a substi tute signed by fifteen senator declaring the investigation-a an end, as all the testimony introduced had completely and over whelmingly vindicated and exonerated Bailey of every charge made agains official integrity personal official integrity and that Bailey at all times had bcon an able, honest and courage ous representative of the peo ple, and loyal and faithful to their interests, etc.
This substitute was adopted in lieu of the original resolu tion by a vote of 15 to 11 .

NEGLECTING THE LAW County Attorney Russell Calls At tention of Physicians to it.

The Commissioners Court has direeted the attention of County Attorny Russell to the fact, as shown by the records of the county clerk, that the law pertaning to vi-
tal statistics is not complied with. In order that there may be no more violation of
this law on the part of physicians, the county attorney requests that the law be published and thus put the doctors throughout the county with its requirements or be with its requirements or
subjected to the penalty scribed therein.
Section 2, of the act of 1903 , creating a bureau of vit
statistics, reads as follows:
"All physicians, surgeons or accoucheurs who may at
tend at the birth of a child, o in the absence of such attendance, either parent of the child, shall report the fact to the clerk of the county court, together with the name of
the parent or parents, the sex of the child and the race to which the child belongs, and whether of foreign or native parents, whether still born or
ative, within thirty days after said birth occurs, under penalty of five dollars for each failure to do so; to be
collected as other fines for misdemeanors àre. All phy sicians, surgeons, ' accoucheur and coroners cognizant of a
death shall report the same todeath shall report the same to
gether with the race, nativity sex, age, residence, whether alien or citizen, and the cause of death, to the clerk of the
county court within thirty days after the occurrence, under a penalty of not less than fifty dollars for each fail ure to do so; these data to be
recorded as a part of the vital statistics of the county and State, and the clerk of the
county court shall be paid by the county ten cents for each birth or death so recorded, and he shall report monthly all these data to the depart ment of public health and vi tal statistics. In detault of
so reporting he shall be fined not less than fifty dollars for each offense."
