#### EXONERATED BY SENATE.

The House to Vote on Bailey Mat- Tax Collector Martin Received ter Today.

Austin, Texas, Feb. 25 .-The senate of Texes today placed a crown of honor and glory on the head of Senator Bailey, and climaxed the farce with applause.

A majority of the senate investigating committee offered a resolution asking the senate for authority to send a subcommittee to examine the books of the Waters Pierce Oil Company and secure the testimony of H. C. Pierce before closing the socalled investigation of Bailey.

This was met with a substitute signed by fifteen senators declaring the investigation at an end, as all the testimony introduced had completely and over whelmingly vindicated and exonerated Bailey of every charge made against him affecting his personal or official integrity and that Bailey at all times had been an able, honest and courageous representative of the people, and loyal and faithful to their interests, etc.

This substitute was adopted in lieu of the original resolution by a vote of 15 to 11.

#### AFTER DELINQUENTS.

Letter From Comptroller.

County Collector Martin announces that unless those persons who are on the delinquent tax roll for personal property make prompt settlement with the tax collector's office that their property will be seized and sold for taxes.

The tax collector is in receipt of a communication from Comptroller J. W. Stephens, which has been addressed to all tax collectors in the State, advising them as to the law in the case and instructing them to preced against delinquents. The communication says in part:

"You will obse: e that the law requires you to seize, levy upon and sell personal property of any person who fails or refuses to pay his taxes on real or personal property or both, by January 31, and this circular is sent vou at this time in order that you may be prepared to comply ing in the troubleous sea of with the law before March 31. settlement."

The tax collector also stated that many lawyers and insurance agents are delinquent in payment of their occupation taxes, and that unless a settlement is made within a rersonable time the matter will be referred to the county attorney and prosecutions in stituted.





**NEGLECTING THE LAW** 

County Attorney Russell Calls Attention of Physicians to it.

The Commissioners Court has directed the attention of County Attorny Russell to the fact, as shown by the records of the county clerk, that the law pertaining to vital statistics is not complied with. In order that there may be no more violation of this law on the part of physicians, the county attorney requests that the law be published and thus put the doctors throughout the county on notice that they must comply of all poisons, and at the same time strengthened and built up. 




