## Five Million Club.

Reports of the Texas Five Million Club's progress throughout the State have so tar been very encouraging. The campaign has not been confined alone to the larger cities, but every day finds it pushing further and further into the smaller communities. and within a month's time there will be no excuse for the display of ignorance concerning the club, its aims and objects on the part of any one.-Nacogdoches Sentinel.

The Five Million Club has what is called, in circles which make a virtue of short and pointed speech, a cinch. If Texas does not come to the scratch in 1910 with 5,000,000 people on her honor roll it will be because the census takers can't find them.
