> In the first place the gov ernor did not approve or sign either one of these two proposed amendments, but filed them in the state department, as he is required to do under the law. The chief executive has no jurisdiction over constitutional amendments and even were he disposed to either sign or veto these two reso lutions, he would have no power to do so. Proposed amendments to the state organie law is a matter between the legislature and the people, and over which the governor has nothing to do. In the event the legislature passes a proposed amendment to be submitted to the people. the governor can not take any action in the premises, however

ROAD SUPERINTENDENT.

Article 4763 of the Revised Statutes of Texas says that the commissioners' court of any county in this state may appoint one road superintendent for such county, or one superintendent in each commissioners' precinct, and such courts are authorized by an order made at any regular term thereof to determine whether there shall be one road superintendent for the county or one for each of the commissioners' precintes there-

Article 4764 provides further: "In case such commissioners' court shall de termine that there shall be one road superintendent, as provided in the preceding article, such court shall ap point a competent road super intendent for such county and in case it is determined that there shall be four super intendents, then such court shall appoint a competent person as road superintendent for each commissioner's precinct in such county."



Constitution Providing for the Creation of Improvement Districts in Certain Cities.

JOINT RESOLUTION amending Section 9. of Article 8, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing for the creation of improvement districts in cities of more than five thousand inhabitants, and charging the cost of certain improvements made therein against the abutting property.

SECTION 1. Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas: That Section 9, Article 8, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be so amended as to hereafter read as fol-

SEC. 9. The State tax on property, exclusive of the tax necessary to pay the public debt, and of the taxes provided for the benefit of public free schools, shall never exceed thirty-five cents on the one hundred dollars valustion; and no county, city or town levy more than twenty-five cents for city or county purposes, not exceeding fifteen cents for roads and bridges; and not exceeding fifteen cents to pay jurors, on the hundred dollars valuation, except for payment of debts incurred prior to the adoption of the amendment September 25, A. D. 1883, and for the erection of public buildings, streets. sewers, water works and other permanent improvements, not to exceed twenty-five cents on the one hundred dollars valuation, in an, one year, and except as is in this Constitution otherwise provided; and the Legislature may also authorize an additional an nual ad valorem tax to be levied and collected for the further maintenance of the public roads; provided, that a majority of the qualified property taxpaying voters of the county voting at an election to be held for that purpose shall vote such tax, not to exceed fifteen cents on the one hundred dollars valuation, of the property subject to taxation in such county. And the Legislature may pass local laws for the maintenance of the public roads and highways, without the local notice required for special or local laws.

Proposed Amendment to the State Constitution Authorizing the Establishment of a State Printing Plant.

JOINT RESOLUTION authorizing the submission to a vote of the people of the State of Texas of a proposed amendment of Section 21, Article XVI, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, relating to printing, publishing, stationery, paper and fuel, and making an appropriation therefor.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

SECTION 1. That Article four (4) of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended by adding thereto Section 27, when a majority of the qualified electors for members of the Lazislature of Texas at an election for that purpose shall vote in favor of the amendment, shall read as follows:

Section 27. The Legislature shall provide for the office of Commissioner of Agriculture, who shall be either elected by the qualified voters of the State, or appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of twothirds of the Senate, as the Legislature may provide; whose term of office, duties and salary shall be prescribed by law: in which department there. shall be established by the Legislature a bureau of labor, when required by the public interest

SEC. 2. The Governor of this State is hereby directed to issue and have published the necessary proclamation for the submission of this resolution to the qualified voters for members of the Legislature of the State of Texas, as an amendment to the Constitution of Texas, to be voted upon on the first Tuesday in August, 1907. All persons favoring said amendments shall have written or printed on their ballots, as follows: 'For the amendment to the Constitution, providing for a Department of Agriculture and a Bureau of Labor. Proposed Amendment to the State Constitution Providing for the Establishment of a Home for Confederate Widows.

JOINT RESOLUTION to amend Section 51 of Article 3 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, as amended in 1903, so as to authorize the grant of aid in the establishment and maintenance of a home for the disabled and dependent wives and widows of Confederate soldiers and sailors and such women as aided the Confederacy, and making an appropriation. Section 51 of Article 3 of the Consti tution of the State of Texas, as amended in 1903, be so amended as to hereafter read as follows:

Article 3. Section 51. The Legislature shall have no power to make any grant or authorize the making of any grant of public money to any individual. associations or individuals, municipal or other corporations whatsoever; provided, however, the Legislature may grant aid to indigent and disabled Confederate soldiers and sailors who came to Texas prior to January 1. 1880, and who are either over sixty years of age or whose disability is the proximate result of actual service in Haselwood & Co. the Confederate army for a period of at least three months, their widows in indigent circumstances who have never remarried and who have been bona fide residents of the State of Texas since March 1, 1880, and who were married to such soldiers anterior to the State of Texas, by adding thereto March 1, 1880; provided said aid shall not exceed eight dollars per month, and provided further, that no appropriations shall ever be made for the purpose hereinbefore specified in excess of five hundred thousand dollars for counties or political subdivisions of any one year. And also grant aid to counties by a majority vote of the the establishment and maintenance of a home for said soldiers and sailors. their wives and widows and women who aided in the Confederacy, under such regulations and limitations as may be provided by law; provided the grant to aid said home shall not exceed one hundred and fifty thousand dollars for any one year, and no inmate of said homes shall be entitled to any other aid from the State; the Legislature may provide for husband and wife to remain together in the home; and provided further, that the provisions of this section shall not be construed to prevent the grant of aid in case of public calemity. Sec. 2. The Governor of the State

is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for the submission of this amendment to the qualified vot ers of the State of Texas on the first Tuesday in August, 1907.
