## RURAL FREE DELIVERY

Many Routes May be Discontinued in the South.

The Postmaster's Advocate the official journal of the United States postal service in discussing the recent de cision of Fourth Assistant Postmaster General DeGraw
concerning the discontinuance of rural mail routes where they are not supported by those living along these routes sounds a timely warning the people of the Sout
"Investigation shows," say the Advocate, "that these
routes are not being patroroutes are not being patro-
nized in the south anything like as liberally as north of the Ohio river. In order to ascertain the cause of the trouble and to see just to generally are being patro nized, the postoffice department during the past tew months ${ }^{\circ}$ instituted a care inquiry throughout country. Special inspector have been instructed to make investigation, and these re-
ports recently submitted account for the department orders discontinuing quite number of rural routes more in the south than afty where else.

able values in the State and able values in the State and
