

Statement From Judge Mims in Regard to the Matter.

To the property tax payers of Nacogdoches County:

In view of the fact that you are to determine by vote on the 6th day of next month whether or not the bonds of Nacogdoches County in the sum of \$75,000 shall be issued for the purpose of building a new court house and jail, wish to state the main reasons causing the commissioner's court to order said election, to wit:

First. The unprotected county; not only those in the office of the county elerk, but those of the other offices of the county, all of which are of the county, and in the preservation of which every citizen is more or less directly interested.

Second. The lack of room for the decent accommodation of jurors required to attend upon the district and county

Third. The absolute necessity for a decent and safe jail for the criminal class.

ibly brought to the atten-

tion of the commissioners court in a petition or memerial from the grand jury serving at the February term, 1907, of our district court; said petition on being signed by each member of the grand jury, and they being representative citizens from the different sections of the county. Railroads Must Provide Equal Accommodations for All Races.

Washington, July 8.—The history of the Cum Concilio some prominent patriotic interstate commerce commisagainst the Nashville, Chattanooga and St. Louis railroad, held that where a railroad provided certain accommodations for first-class passengers of the white race it is commanded by law that like accommodations be provided for negroes who purchase firstclass tickets. It holds in this case that it is manifest that the railroad "unduly and unjustly discriminated in some particulars against colored passengers," and orders that where a railroad provides a wash bowl and towels in coaches for white passengers, and separate smoking compartments, similar accommodations must be provided for negroe passengers paying similar fares. The ladies of Nacogdoch have done well for themselves and for Texas in preserving to future generations the historical old stone fort at that place, about which so many traditions of East Texas cling.

The old fort was built in the earliest days of the settlement of East Texas for protection against the Indians. 
