Second—Any house, boarding car, tent or dwelling occupied by the employes engaged in any industry shall contain at least 300 cubic feet of air space for each occupant thereof. In order to accommodate fitty men therefore a building should be fifty feet long, thirty feet broad and ten feet high. It shall be further provided with such ventilation as hereinafter described and mentioned The floor of every dwelling shall be constructed of boards or planks, or other materia equally suitable for the purpose, raised on supports at least one foot from the ground, and so made that it shall be tight. Every such dwelling other than a temporary tent, not exceeding ten by fifteen feet, shall be supplied with adequate lighting; and in all wooden or iron structures, the windows must be so constructed that they can be readily opened.

Third-Proper ventilation shall always be provided, and a suitable number of openings, windows or doors, shal be supplied in such manner that 8000 cubic feet of air per hour shall be available for each occupant of each dwelling.

Fourth-Every camp shall be supplied with a building and set spart as a kite ming room or eating room in connection therewith, with proper conveniences for the cleanliness of the employes.

THAT ANTI-PASS LAW.

New Believed Children Must Pay Full Fare.

Among the several questions concerning the anti-free pass law which are now being investigated in the attorney general's department is one that is causing the officials considerable anxiety, says the Austin Statesmen, for it is realized that the ruling will affect a great many people, and may be adverse to the interest of many among those least able to pay. The question has been asked if under the law the railroads will be permitted to carry free as heretofore children under 5 years of age, and for half fare children under 12 years of age.

The statute very carefully and specifically enumerates all the exemptions to whom tree passes may be given, and declares that any person other than those excepted in the act who accepts and uses free transportation over any railway or other carrying line, or uses a less rate of fare than is received from any other person for a like service, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction for each offense fined not less that \$100 nor more than \$1000. The railroad officials are also made liable for granting the discrimination and made subect to a like fine and in addition may be sentenced to serve a term in the penitentiary. 
