

Unorganized Counties Will Not Share in Apportionment.

It was disclosed, yesterday hat the unorganized counties in the state will not be able to get any of the land which was set apart for each county in Texas for county school funds for the very good reason that the 225 leagues of land set apart for that purpose has been exhausted.

In 1882 the legislature passed an act setting apart 325 leagues of land for county school purposes. Each county that had not already received its quantity was granted four le agues, or 17,-712 acres. This was to be used as a permanent school fund for each county in addition to the state's appropriation for school purposes. These 325 leagues, according to Acting Land Commissioner Robison, have just been exhausted. Garza, the land county organized, will not get the full four leagues, and those counties, as stated above, which have not yet or ganized, will get no land at all for school purposes, as the law provides that the counties shall get the land only after organization. - Austin States




