Douglass whs laid off in town lots in 1837, and named in honor of Gen. Kelsey H. Douglass, who was a prominent merchant $\frac{1}{2}$ nd citizen of Nacogdoches in 1835 . He was also a Brigadier General of all the troops in Eastern Texas in 1839 during the Indian war with the Cherokee Indians.
We have a fine country in and around Douglass; and generally is tertile, health good; good water, and fine range for stock of all kinds and land is cheaper here than anywhere else in the country. All we want is more good people to come to our section and help build it up. We have here a -fine two story
school house with ample room school house with ample room
