 intendent R. W. Tillery.Hon. R. W. Tillery, county superintendent of public instruction, has just forward ed his annual report to State Superintendent Cousins Austin. Austin. The report shows that the general average of the. last term of the white schools of Nacogdoches county, exclusive of the independent districts, was five months, or 122 days, and that of the colored;schools was 86 days.

## The average term would

 have been longer had it not been for the ruling of the State Superintendent that the term of all schools must be taught continuously, and without irtermission. The rulingjwas made after manyof the schools had so far advanced toward the close of their term that it was too late y the trustees and agreed on A number of the county schools have money left ove from lastyear's apportionment which, with the $\$ 6$ per capit pportioned for this year, wil give them a larger term than
