THE champion cotton picking record of this season was recently made in McLennan county, when four men picked two bales of cotton in one day. The pickers and their records were as follows: J. W. McCorkle, 845 pounds; Emmitt Caskey, 843 pounds; Clarence Hill, 775 pounds; John Butts, 620 pounds, making a total of 3,083 pounds in one day.

JUST two months after the election, it is definitely ascertained that all the constitutional amendments voted on August 6 were defeated. It had been thought that the amendment providing for a home for widows of confederate veterans had been adopted, but it is now stated that this amendment was defeated by over 2500 majority. The people have shown by their votes that they are averse to having any more additions tacked onto the state's constitution.

THE Beaumont Journal dishes out this roast to be masticated by the juries of Texas: "When a jury, in a damage suit brings in a verdict for the plaintiff for one cent and costs the members disregard their oath to give the parties litigating an impartial trial. Especially is this so where a railroad is the defendant. The verdict implies that the plaintiff has not been damaged. If he had been one cent could not possibly be compensation, hence the verdict is solely for the purpose of requiring the railroad company to pay the court costs. A verdict prompted by such a motive is nothing more nor less than a conspiracy to rob, and it is surprising that supposedly intelligent white men would be guilty of such conspiracy."

CONCRETE has not invariably justified the confidence of its users and advocates, but a story comes from Tunis, in Northern Africa, which shows that this material will sometimes hang together under rather trying circumstances, notes the New York Tribune. A five-story warehouse, erected in a marshy part of the city, showed a disposition to assume the attitude of the famous Tower of Pisa. When it was tilted over at an angle of 25 degrees from the perpendicular the task of making it once more strictly upright was undertaken. The object was attained by undermining the highest side, and in the end the structure stood at a considerably lower level than was originally contemplated, but it is said to have remained as intact as if it had been a single block of stone.

THE Abilene Reporter calls attention to a pertinent matter in the following: "President Neill of the Texas Farmers Union says that Col. E. S. Peters had no authority to speak for that union in presenting a petition to the railroad commission for two cent passenger fares. The colonel is not an officer of the union, unless it be a local, and that body hasn't taken any action in any part of the state upon the fare question, according to President Neill. Col. Peters will perhaps answer that he was acting secretary of some local union. It is his only getting out place. It is understood that the farmers want lower rates on freight rather than passenger fares, which does not interest them so much as the leisure classes, who travel so much."

THE Eastern and Northern newspapers and politicians are trying very hard to settle on a candidate for the Democratic nomination for president, but so far as the Democratic masses are concerned, that question is already settled. His name is Bryan. The paramount question is not who will be the candidate, but

can the Democratic party all circumstances considered, expect to elect its candidates at the next presidential election? It depends entirely upon the Democratic party. If it follows the usual course in preparing a platform which does not differ essentially from that of its opponent, it is doomed to defeat. If, on the other hand, it presents new and vital issues, based upon admitted Democratic principles and of interest to the whole country, it is bound to win. We must oppose impulse with principle and above all show sincerity in the platform and in the nomination of the candidate.

TOBACCO IN OHIO.

Does Not Compare With Lowest Grade of Nacogdoches Weed.

The following letter from a tobacco grower in Ohio to Mr. J. L. Gill, manager of Redfield farm, will give some idea of the tobacco industry in the Buckeye state:

Dear Sir: Your letter was received and read with pleasure; also samples of earth and tobacco came in O. K.

All very interesting to us and it's hard for us to understand how you can raise tobacco on a soil like that. It looks to me to be nothing but brick dust.

We have a fine black soil in most of this country, mixed in places with a rich gray clay, and we get 2000 pounds per acre of Ohio Seed Leaf; 1400 to 1800 pounds per acre of Little Dutch, and 1000 to 1300 pounds of Spanish per acre. These are all cigar tobaccos, and we get 11c per pound for Dutch, 12 1-2c per pound for Seed Leaf and 14c per pound for Spanish. The highest price ever paid for this kind of tobacco in the history of this country was this year. It is hard for us to believe that you get 40c per pound for your kind or for the kind that you send me sample of. You did not mention name and we know nothing of its quality, only that it is very strong and does not smoke like ours does.

I live right in the heart of the best tobacco county in Ohio—Franklin Township, Darke county, and we rank first in quality and quantity, and during delivery time \$25,000 per week is paid to farmers for tobacco alone.

Let me know if you ever lived in Ohio or the east and if you have not I will send you a sample of our soil and different kinds of tobacco. Also give me the name of this sample you sent me. We raise 10 acres of tobacco every year on our farm; have a shed 109x36x16 feet and enough room in the barn for 3 acres. Our crop last year, 1906, filled them up to the brim.

Some leaves 31 inches long and from 25 to 33 leaves to the stalk of Little Dutch. Seed Leaf gets very large. Land here is worth \$200 per acre, but pikes to a finish. I beg to remain yours truly, E. R. Falkner.

Eyes on Texas.

Beaumont, Enterprise. A Virginia peanut company is complaining of high freight rates from Texas points to the Atlantic seaboard and says that his company can get peanuts from Spain and Japan cheaper than it can get the Texas nuts and pay the freight charges now asked to the seaboard.

There seems to be two lessons in this, first that Texas is handicapped in excessive freight rates to the east, and second, that not only peanut factories, but cotton factories and other like industries should come to the spot where the raw material is produced.

The statement of the Bain Peanut company that if it cannot get lower freight rates it will be forced to come to Texas to establish a cleaner, gives a somewhat humorous turn to the situation, in that Texas would like nothing better than to see the eastern manufacturers forced by circumstances to set up shops in this state.

The fact is, the East has been too long the manufacturing center of the country and everything from freight rates to finance has been based on New York. Texas is an empire in itself and can with calm judgment and proper management, build up a prestige for itself.

It should establish and hold its own market in everything, and a few years of this policy will turn the eyes of the world this way. Already, New York is wildly wondering where is the cotton it has been selling so assuredly on paper, and if Texas will, it can market its own cotton and leave New York still to wonder.

It is to be hoped that the Virginia peanut companies will come to Texas, as one of them has already done. There is room in the old state for all.

Hemphill Leader. **CHANGE OF VENUE.**

**Case Against Dr. Lockhart Transferred to Cherokee County.**

From Monday's Daily:  
Soon after the convening of court this morning the attorneys for Dr. J. J. Lockhart, charged by indictment with the murder of Ollie Branch, near Appleby, on August 25, filed a motion for change of venue.

An affidavit signed by two citizens was also filed, alleging that it is impossible for the defendant to get a fair and impartial trial in this county.

A number of witnesses were placed on the stand in substantiation of the motion and affidavit. The principal contention of the attorneys for the defendant was that articles published in the county newspapers had so influenced the minds of the people that a fair and impartial jury could not be secured in the county.

The state's attorneys having failed to combat or controvert the affidavit of the defense, the court granted the application for a change of venue, and after consultation, the attorneys agreed that the case be transferred to Rusk, Cherokee county.

**KILLING IN ANGELINA.**

**Will Jarrell Killed By Dr. J. K. Castleberry.**

Last Saturday evening about 7 o'clock, Jim Jarrell, a young married man, was shot and killed by Dr. J. K. Castleberry at Kelly's logging camp, eight miles west of Lutkin.

From parties who returned from Lutkin Sunday, it is learned that the killing was done solely in self defense. Jarrell had met Dr. Castleberry at the commissary Saturday morning, when he abused the doctor, telling him he, Jarrell, was armed and if the doctor was armed they would have it out right then. Dr. Castleberry started to go to his home, when Jarrell followed him, and then abused him with all the epithets he could think of.

Dr. Castleberry followed him to his house. Late Saturday evening Dr. Castleberry had to go to the commissary to fix up some medicine for a patient. Jarrell was there and he again began abusing the doctor and finally drew his knife and advanced on the doctor with the knife open. Dr. Castleberry backed off from Jarrell and begged him not to come on him, but Jarrell continued to advance, and when within about six feet of the doctor, Castleberry fired with a .38 caliber pistol. It fired four shots, all of which took effect, and Jarrell fell with his open knife in his hand.

Dr. Castleberry came to Lutkin Sunday morning and surrendered to Sheriff Watts, and soon after waived examination and was released on \$5000 bond.

Dr. Castleberry formerly lived near Nacogdoches and is well known here.

CABLE COINCIDENCE.

Brothers Meet After 23 Years Under Peculiar Circumstances.

There was one incident connected with the trial of J. L. Garrett, which has been in progress in the district court the past three days, that is indeed remarkable.

In selecting the jury, each man drawn on the venire was examined separately, as is the case in all capital cases. When the name of J. M. Moody was reached, he was asked the customary questions, after which District Attorney Strong announced that the State would take the juror.

"Do you know that man?" asked Judge Middlebrook of his client.

"I do not," replied Mr. Garrett, "but seems to me I have seen him before."

"The juror will be excused," said Judge Middlebrook, and Mr. Moody took his seat in the audience in the court room.

Friday-morning, after the jury had been secured and the taking of testimony had begun, the prisoner on trial and Mr. Moody recognized each other as brother-in-law, Mr. Moody having married Mr. Garrett's sister several years ago.

Mr. Moody sent word to J. W. Garrett of Melrose to come to town Saturday without fail, he wanted to see him on important business. When Mr. Garrett reached Nacogdoches about noon yesterday, he recognized the man on trial for the murder of Thad Weaver as a brother whom he had not seen in 23 years.

The two brothers last met in Louisiana 23 years ago, and J. L. Garrett had mourned his brother, sister and other-in-law as dead, he thinking they had all lost their lives in the Galveston flood.

The strange part of the story is the fact that J. L. Garrett has lived in Nacogdoches county for several years, and has been in his present trouble since April, 1906, and neither his brother or brother-in-law ever suspected that he was their own dear relative, though they both have lived in the vicinity of Melrose for more than eight years.

Bring Your Nuts to Nacogdoches, Lufkin Tribune.

Nacogdoches is confident of securing the peanut factory in time to work up next season's crop, and as there are quite a number of Angelina farmers awakening to the diversification idea with the intention of planting less cotton, or none at all, it would be a good idea to study up on peanut culture a little. The idea that the farmers are liable to plant too much acreage in peanuts and over do the thing seems to be exploded by the fact that the nuts are worth about as much for oil as they are when put up as confection. Two car loads a day, or even twenty car loads per week, it is said, can be "manufactured" by some of the factories now in operation, and with their products being pushed in this country and in Europe—and the demands growing every day, it is not likely that over production will hurt the prices for a few years, if ever. The farmers of this county are interested in the Nacogdoches factory on account of it being so conveniently near, but they will not be forced to sell to that factory, as other competitive buyers and factories will be on hand to buy the

crop. As there are several varieties it would be a good idea to ascertain the kind demanded by the manufacturers, and give the matter of cultivation and preparation for market a close study.

Amendments to the Amendment, Dallas News. To show just how too many changes and too much tinkering have balled up the Texas code, read the following title to Chapter 75 of the laws of the last Legislature:

An act to amend Chapter 153 of the General Laws of the State of Texas, passed at the regular session of the Twenty-Fifth Legislature, and amended at the regular session of the Twenty-Sixth Legislature and at the regular session of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature, and at the first called session of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature, and at the regular session of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature, and at the regular session of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature. An act to prohibit the taking of fish from the fresh waters and streams of this State otherwise than by means of the ordinary hook and line and trot-line; and to prohibit the sale or shipping of game fish in this State; and to provide penalties for the violation thereof, by fixing as penalty for the use of poison, dynamite, or other explosives in killing, catching and taking fish; also regulating the sale and shipment of fish, and declaring an emergency.
