lat Rusk from some point on the Beaumont-Dallas line, probab ly from Recklaw or an adjacent station. For more than a year rumors have been rife that such would be don forestall the extension on to state road, but now the announcement comes author itatively. Within the coming month actual construction will be started. In Houston
and elsewhere the railroad company is now forming its corps of roadbuilders and these are to be sent to the place as soon as the last and
conclusive survey of a route is made. This is now being done, and is expected to be
finished within two weeks or such matter ot time. The distance to be built is hardly
more than ten miles, but it more than ten miles, but it will afford a direct, route to the east for the products of the Rusk penitentiary, in-
stead of via Jacksonville to make connection there with Houston Chronicle.
