Has Introcuced a Bill for Nacog doches Postoffice.

The following bill for the erection of public building at Nacogdoches was introduced by Congressman Cooper on December 5 , and referred to committee on Public Buildings and Grounds and ordered printed
"Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representative of the United States of America in Congress assem bled, that the Sectretary of the Treasury be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to acquire, by purchase, site and cause to be erected thereon a suitable building, ncluding fireproot vaults heating and ventilating apparatus, elevators, approaches,
and other necessary appurteances, for the use and accom modation of the postoffice and other Government offices at Nacogdoches, Texas, the cost luding said vaults,'tieating and venṭilating apparatus, elevators, approaches, and apthe sum of fitty thousand dollars, which sum is hereby appropriated for said purpose
