Dr. Mayfeld Writes Interestingly of the Industry-Brief History.

In the special edition of the Galveston News there appeared a letter regarding the tobacco industry in this section, written by Dr. J. E. Mayfield of this city, a gentleman as well versed on that subject as any one possibly. The letter will prove of much worth to the people interested in growing tobacco, and we take pleasure in reproducing it.


