



THE TOBACCO BUSINESS.

Nacogdoches made up and sent to Anstin a lot of its very best eigars, and now the legislature knows what a real Texas smoke is like.

The government tobacco experts in East Texas are getting busy and will supervise the planting of tobacco throughout all of the tobacco growing counties.

The rumor that the agricultural department at Washington was to discontinue the demonstration work in the Nacogdoches tobacco district because of the apathy of the farmers, has aroused the aforesaid farmers and they are now hustling to get out tobacco crops. It sometimes takes a little prodding to get a man to do something that is for his own good. — Beaumont Enterprise.

Three hundred dollors profit per acre' is pretty good. That is the record in Nacog doches county on tobacco crops. Our farmers should be reaping some of these good things.

The success of the tobacco industry is now an assured fact in Nacogdoches county. There is just as good soil for growing tobacco around Mt. 
