

The file was found embedded in the fibre of the pine, evidently having been put in long ago and the grain of the wood had grown over the steel. This is evident from the fact that, the file was embedded with the handle end slanting inward and downward, the wider end first, while the groove in which the file rested was nar rower at the upper end than at the lower showing that the file had not been driven in Just how long ago, and how it came to be embedded in the pine cannot be conjec-


