Science students at Farwell High School were treated to a program on alternatives in the consumption of
energy resource energy resources by Mrs. Mary
Peckinpaugh, chemistry professor of Peckinpaugh, chemistry professor of
Eastern New Mexico University Roswell Campus last Monday, April
Mrs. Peckinpaugh utilized a special digital computer developed by Sandia Labs and the University of New
Mexico in her presentation. The Mexico in her presentation. The
computer was programmed to consider energy resources, energy demands, population growth factor, and food development factor as they relate to energy usage.
Students were allowed to adjus determine the most advantageous decisions that could be made to help

 Details About Tornado(Editor's note: Police Chief Wayne
Hendrix of Vernon is a Hendrix of Vernon is a cousin of

this first-hand report on the tornado which hit his city on Tuesday, in hopes it may be of help to make peopue aware of the unpredictable BY WAYNE HENDRIX Vernon Police Chief
The tornado which hit Tuesday The tornado which hit Tuesday
was one of the worst tragedies to
ever hit Was one of the worst tragedies to
ever hit our community, but $I$ feel
we were lucky, if you can call it thet we were lucky, if you can call it that.
The storm hit Vernon's southeast The storm hit Vernon's southeast
edge, just affecting a small portion edge, just affecting a small portion
of the residential area. It sort of
turned east ane turned east at one point, and if it had
not, it could have hit our hospital, not, it could have hit our hospital,
our mental health center, and our heavily populated area.
We can thand our We can thank the Lord that the
storm went the direction it did, or we storm went the direction it did, or we could have had a lot more fatalities
than we had, and considerably more property damage.
We had 11 fatalities in Vernon, and 66 injus, serious. Only four of some more were in the residential area. The other seven were motorists killed in
automobiles automobiles on the expressway,
when they drove right into th, storm. It is really unbelievable what these things can do to an automobile. I used to think that an automobile would be a relatively safe place in
which to be if a tornado hit, but $\mathbf{I}$ which to e if a tornado hit, but I
think I've changed my opinion on this. We saw semi-trailers and large
18-wheelers turn 18 -wheelers turned over on their
sides and backs. We first gat a report of a tornado watch about 2 p.m. Tuesday, and

3:30 p.m., one of our units about 13
miles out called in a report of a
funnel on the ground. We had a city
commission meeting in progress, commission meeting in progress
con the ground. We had a city and I broke into the meeting and and I broke into the meeting and
notified the city officials. We then took all of our units (five or six) and went out to watch the cloud. It got real black-it was one of
those huge black clouds, where it looks like it will rain the bottom out.
We had about six looks like it will rain the bottom out.
We had about six units watching the cloud, and none of us ever
spotted a funnel as the cloud spotted a funnel as the clouc
approached the city, but I finally
radioed the dispor approached the city, but finally to sound the storm warning. That
was some eight or ten minutes was some eight or ten minutes
before it hit the city, which was about $3: 55$ p.m.
Let me point out that we try not to Let me point out that we try not to
sound the alarm unless we have sound the alarm unless we have
reason for people to seek cover, so it reason for people to seek cover, so it
makes us hesitant to ring the alarm unless we have a funnel cloud
definitely spotted. Down here, we definitely spotted. Down here, we
have these tornado alerts or watches have dhese tornado alerts or
for days an times. We have also had Civil Defense people show us how to watch cloud,
and give warnings, but this wasn' and give warnings, but this wasn't
anything like I had ever seen, either in person or on film.
