JOE M. FULLER DEAD.

Well Known Citizen and Merchan of Attoyac Died Here Sunday Night-Was Buried at Black Jack.

After having been confined to his bed for some time with a malady that baffled all medical skill, Mr. Joe M. Fuller, a well known cititizen and prominent merchant of Attoyac, this county, died in this city Sunday night at 7 o'clock. He had been brought here some ten days before to the local sanitarium, where he was operated on in hopes of saving his life, but after an heroic struggle on his part and all that could be done for him by physicians' skill the battle was lost. Mr. Fuller was conscious up to the last hour of his life and made all arrangements for the proper disposition of his estate and the settlement of his business affairs. 




