Jan. 18-A complete presentation of the farmers' cooperative societies of the western+states, will be an interesting educational feature of the Iowa State exhibit at the Fitth National Corn Exposition, which opens here the 27th of this month. The exhibit will show the methods by which these societies conduct their affairs, and especial emphases will be laid on the cooperative grain elevator organizations. A model grain elevator will be demonstrated in actual operation, and the exhibit will be supplemented by a series of lectures giving full knowledge of the various phases of these cooperative societies.

The development of these farmers' cooperative societies in lowa has proceeded to a greater extent, probably, than in any other state of the Union, and it is especially fitting that such an exhibit agricultural extension de-
