Amarillo, Tex., March 30. -Reports from the farming localities along the Panhandle lines of both the Santa Fe and Rock Island indicate the wheat acreage will be much greater this year than last, the estimated increase running as high as thirty per cent. A good moi sture is already in the round in nearly every locality of the Panhandle and a wheat shipment of between 3,000,000 and 4,000,000 bushels would not be surprising.


Jefferson Secures Cotton Oil Mill. Jefferson, Texas, March 27 -Through the efforts of the Progressive League this city has secured a cotton oil mill which will more than utilize the seed from this section of the state and will also draw large quantities of raw materi al from sections of Louisiana.
